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





Focusing on the Top 5 Areas of Impact, NMI mobilizes the local church in missions and keeps congregations engaged in Nazarene Missions globally.



In 2020, 12 shipments (plus local distributions) with a Fair Market Value of \$1.3 million USD, were sent to world areas and in the States for disaster relief and vulnerable people support efforts. Due to the continued Covid pandemic restrictions we are still unable to host volunteer groups but encourage churches to be involved. There is currently an urgent need for Crisis Care Kits. Any questions about CCKs or delivering them to the warehouse may be sent to office@fawngrovecc.org or you may call the warehouse direct at 410-452-8699. We would also ask that churches consider financial donations which may be sent to Fawn Grove Compassion Center, 5300 Fawn Grove Rd, Pylesville, MD 21132. Donations to FGCC are 10% Approved Missions Specials. Nazarene churches should report all funds given to FGCC on their Point to Point giving in order to receive the Approved Missions Special credit.

Include **only those items listed below. *Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs.*** Set the CCKs in groups of six (6) to determine the number of banana boxes needed.

2. Pack contents below into a clear 2-gallon OR 2.5-gallon plastic Ziploc bag and seal:

- 1 medium-size bottle of shampoo (12-18 oz.),
please tape flip-tops closed
- 2 bars of soap (bath-size or larger)
- 1 medium toothpaste (4.0-6.4 oz.)
- 3 toothbrushes (in original packaging)
- 1 box of Band-Aids (30 or more)
- 1 fingernail clipper
- 1 sturdy hair comb
- 2 hand towels (no small washcloths)
- 4 pocket-size packages of facial tissue
- 1 Beanie Baby-size stuffed toy

3. Obtain the banana boxes from your local grocery store. **Please ship CCKs solely in banana boxes, as they provide uniformity, eliminating wasted space in shipping.**

4. Cut the heavy brown paper (usually found in the banana box) in half and place inside the bottom of the box. Tape the other half over the hole in the lid. (Plain cardboard may be used in the same way if your banana boxes are missing the paper.)

5. Fill each box with **six (6) CCKs—no more, no less.**

6. **Do not insert money or literature** (including anything with the church's name on it, notes, etc.) in the CCKs or banana boxes.

GREETINGS

General Superintendent, Dr. Carla D. Sunberg; Eastern Nazarene College President, Dr. Jack Connell; DS Emeritus, Dr. Kenneth Mills; Pastors, Associates, Delegates and Friends of this *one hundred fourteenth* Assembly of the Mid-Atlantic District Church of the Nazarene. It is a joy to greet you in the powerful name of Jesus our Risen Savior and Coming King!

It is a great joy to bring my fifth report as the Superintendent of the Mid-Atlantic District. By the help of God and with confidence in His power we gather in these moments to recognize and affirm our commitment to the ongoing mission of the Mid-Atlantic District, *“to advance the ministry of Jesus Christ.”*

It is a privilege to welcome you to this sacred gathering and conversation as a district family. We have gathered to be accountable to one another as well as to the One who has called us to this part of God’s Mission Field. I am grateful that for those present and those joining us online as together we make a fresh commitment to *“Strengthen What Remains!”*

A FRESH LOOK AT OUR MISSION FIELD

In the providence of God, He has entrusted the task of leadership and ministry to each of us in the middle of this global pandemic.

Many have reached their *“limits of tolerance”* as a result of the disequilibrium caused by extended periods of isolation and uncertainty. Ministry strategies that have worked well for decades seem anemic in the face of the uncertainty brought by the circumstances we find ourselves in.

In his book entitled, *Leadership on the Line: Staying Alive Through the Dangers of Change*, Ron Heifetz suggests that *“Treating the issues (i.e. Pandemic) as a technical problem rather than an adaptive challenge”*¹ can prove to be frustrating and leave leadership feeling ineffective.

Leading in this moment has evidenced new realities that must be addressed if we are to emerge with new ministry models that reflect the kingdom and its values. Here are valuable lessons that we have learned in this new moment in history.

- People can express openness to the idea of change and may not embrace the changes necessary to implement new models of ministry.

- Ideas seldom get leaders in trouble, but how they are implemented can get you in trouble.
- Learning to distinguish the essential questions sooner rather than later might be one of the central tasks of leaders.
- Most people want their problems identified, solved all without interrupting their own preferences and priorities.

It may seem like these lessons are negative, but I see each of these as a possibility to see the inbreaking moments of the Kingdom of God in this world. When all of this is over (and it will be,) it may cause us to wonder which parts of “*normal*” will no longer seem useful to us? As bad as COVID-19 is, waiting COVID-19 out may be equally challenging for us.

What should we “*do?*” may not be the right question as we move forward. Let me remind you that as the church, we are to reach out *WITH* the good news, and we are to reach out *AS* the good news.

John Chandler in his new book entitled, *Uptick: A Blueprint for Finding and Forming the Next Generation of Pioneering and Kingdom Leaders*, suggests that, “*We tend to think “tree” when God is calling to “orchard.”*”¹ It is a joy to serve in this “*orchard*” with you!

OUR IDENTITY

Since our last gathering in April of 2020 via the Internet, I continue to experience the faithfulness of God’s presence as I travel across the Mid-Atlantic District. God’s gracious activity is apparent in the life of the churches on this great district. Participating in what God is doing in the lives of His people is an incredible joy. Even though no two places are alike, we serve a God who is the same “*yesterday, today and forever.*”

This year has tested the resolve of our churches and her leadership. In spite of this time of incredible challenge I am happy to report that this has been a great year. We are guided by principles and promises that ensure His sustaining Presence.

I continually re-affirm my pledge to give my best efforts toward leading from these ***“shared”*** values and commitments. I remain deeply committed to these seminal concepts and continue to look for innovative ways to fulfill these contextual expectations.

Our **Shared Vision, Purpose, Values and Ministry Principles** have skillfully guided our ongoing efforts to fulfill the Great Commission and involve ourselves in the work of the Kingdom of God over this past year.

PERSONAL GRATITUDE

The Mid-Atlantic District is replete with leaders who are gifted and who daily offer their best efforts under the Spirit's anointing to bring direction to our shared work.

Each year as I come to write these words, I am reminded that words are not adequate to express my sincere appreciation for the work and leadership of District Superintendent Emeritus, Dr. Kenneth L. Mills who has been a trusted friend and encouragement in my life. A large part of what we are privileged to enjoy today had its origin in his mind and heart and for this I will always be grateful.

The District Advisory Board has worked tirelessly over this past year to bring their perspective, support and prayer to the work of the Mid-Atlantic District. They are exemplary leaders and gifted servants who daily have prayed that God would enable us to fulfill our calling.

PERSONAL ACCOUNTABILITY

2020-2021 will long be remembered as the year of COVID-19. Although there are a myriad of opinions about the seriousness of this virus, it is a recognized fact that it has deeply impacted our churches. To be sure, there have been negative impacts, however, there have also been a number of positive results coming from the reality of this devastating outbreak.

Consider the following Strategic District Initiatives that were implemented early in the rise of COVID-19.

- **“Moments of Hope” Conversations** – Each Monday evening the leadership from across the Mid-Atlantic District gathered for a time of connection and encouragement. The attendance and response were overwhelmingly positive.
- **“Voices of Hope” Conversations** – Tuesday and Friday afternoons were an opportunity for the leadership across the Mid-Atlantic District to participate in a time of encouragement. These sessions were led by sages who encouraged and supported our leaders. Presenters included: Dr. Dan Boone, Rev. Dana Preusch, Dr. Jesse Middendorf, Dr. Carla Sunberg, Dr. Jack Connell, Alan Hirsch, Dr. David Busic, Dr. Gustavo Crocker and Dr. Jeren Rowell.
- **Cohort Conversations V.1 – V.6** – As the larger conversations developed, there was an increasing need to break down into smaller conversations. Six groups of six to eight pastors met to think about the unique and contextual challenges brought on by the pandemic.
- **Affinity Groups** – Three groups were designed to meet for four weeks to explore these issues more deeply. The focus was around the ideas of “*adaptive leadership*” and examining the metrics that will account for our shared work.
- **Ephesians 4 - Training Event** – On Saturday, March 7, 2020, Ryot Church of the Nazarene hosted the **Ephesians 4 Leadership Training Event** designed to train

leaders in APEST thinking, Strengths-Finders and Emotional Intelligence models for ministry. Six churches participated in this training event on the western end of the Mid-Atlantic District. Special thanks to the leadership teams from Bedford, Frostburg, Oakland, Petersburg, Pleasant Ridge, and the Ryot church.

- **Zoom** – Pre-Pandemic, Zoom was a little-known option for conducting meetings via the Internet. Since the inception of COVID-19 I have participated in 201 Zoom calls. The cumulative total of participants over this last year totaled 5,341 people (this is the sum total of the Zoom calls and does not account for how many people would have been on multiple calls.) The sum total of minutes of the 201 Zoom calls is 261,673 (4,361 hours)

The results of these efforts have paid rich dividends as leaders have had the opportunity to connect across the digital divide. Even though we were separated by factors that prevented us from gathering face to face, there were many opportunities to do so via Zoom.

It has been a joy to work with the congregations and ministry leaders across the Mid-Atlantic District. Driving 21,890 miles to meetings and congregational visits has given me a front row seat to God's gracious activity in the life of His church.

It has been my privilege to serve the local church by:

- Meeting with one hundred and forty-five pastors and leaders for a meal or coffee.
- Preaching at twenty-three different churches
- Preaching forty-three times at churches across the District.
- Conducted 66 Church Board Meetings

It has been my privilege to serve the district by:

- Leading twenty-one District Staff meetings at the District Missional Resource Center.
- Chairing four District Advisory Boards
- Guiding the Board of Ministry
- Conducting three Ordination Seminars
- Conducting Cohort Meetings
- Leading Pastor's & Spouses Retreat
- Leading Mid Atlantic District Executive Retreat
- Leading new Leaders Orientation
- Participating in Committees (Family Camp Program, TEAM Day and Finance Committee)

It has been my privilege to serve the Eastern Field by:

- Eastern Field District Superintendent's Field Retreat

LOOKING FORWARD

We continue to work on the rebirth of three strategic congregations in different areas of the Mid-Atlantic District. Each of these congregations has a storied past and possesses great promise for the future.

Annapolis Hope Rising – This church will enter into its next stage of development over the next several months. With a change in leadership and a renewed focus to the principles that have brought it into existence, there are promising days ahead for this important ministry initiative. Please continue to pray for God's direction and for provision as we work in the days ahead.

Washington, DC Mosaic – Since the hiring of Dr. Bryan Todd as the Executive Director of the Washington, DC Mosaic, work has moved steadily along and the Webster Street properties are nearing completion which will allow revenue to be generated allowing new ministry initiatives in the 16th Street building. COVID has severely impaired the ongoing use of the church building and active measures are being employed to prepare the building for future ministry. A comprehensive study of the community has been completed, an intensive evaluation of the current facilities has been undertaken and an evaluation of the current ministries as well as the future opportunities have been analyzed. The future is bright and the possibilities for effective and innovative ministries are on the horizon.

State College - Home to Penn State University, this community is ripe with opportunities to plant the Church of the Nazarene and to create a robust worshipping community. We continue to explore leadership options as well as those who may feel called to serve in this growing mission field.

I want to express my deep appreciation to the Access Church and her leadership for their care and stewardship of the State College property. Pastor Zac and Ashley McDonald continue to be prayer and ministry partners as we contemplate the future.

CLOSING

Contained in the third chapter of the book of Revelation we find these poignant words.

“To the angel of the church in Sardis write:

These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead. ² *Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God.* ³ Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. The temptation is to look for quick fixes through programs, plans or other paraphernalia that may provide a short-term solution but may in the long run leave us floundering in the wilderness.

Last year I closed this report with this paragraph and I want to use it again this year. My prayer is that as the Mid-Atlantic District, we will make decisions that future generations will recognize and benefit from. My prayer is that the decisions we make will extend the borders of the kingdom and that people will be swept into joy of obediently fulfilling God’s purposes.

By God’s help, I pledge my best efforts to continue to write a “*letter to the future*” that will be grounded in His grace!

3. District NMI President

District Superintendent Dr. Bowser, Dr. Carla Sunberg, District NMI Council, delegates, members, friends, and guest, it is my privilege to present my first annual report for the Mid-Atlantic District Nazarene Missions International (NMI).

Recap 2020-

A wise woman once said, “We’ve never done it this way before!” and that pretty much sums up 2020 on the Mid- Atlantic. What a year to start my term as District President! Congregations were not meeting in person. Many people were out of work. Fear of the unknown was changing the way that we had traditionally done everything. What would happen to NMI amidst uncertainty and challenging times?

Even though 2020 caught us by surprise, it did not catch God by surprise! I believe He used this past year to grow, challenge, and most importantly He stripped away the distractions to let us see how He is still at work and in control. Even through a Pandemic God is Good and will build His kingdom!

Our NMI Presidents and congregations did not give up or put their ministry on hold. They successfully continued to answer the needs around them. They continued encouraging their congregations to **Pray** for our Missionaries and the lost around the world. Reports frequently came in that missionaries were either stranded in their country of service or that they were unable to fly back to their country of calling.

Even though we could not travel internationally, that did not stop us from supporting the Missional work around the world. Amidst an unheard of Coin Shortage our churches still gave generously in their **Alabaster** Offerings. The \$33,290.12 that the Mid Atlantic raised for Alabaster will be used to grow the church around the world! Your faithfulness will continue to make a tremendous difference for years to come!

Since we were not meeting in person, the traditional ways of **Engaging our Children and Youth** would not work. However with fewer distractions our children were able to engage with local compassionate ministries alongside the adults in their congregations. Children and Adults fed their communities, and found ways to bring hope during trying times.

God’s people continued to be generous in supporting the **World Evangelism Fund** this past year. This might not have been our highest giving year in the books, but you all did a fantastic job giving a total of \$615,331.04. This amount is really incredible and should be celebrated, given the fact that churches were not meeting weekly and many of our congregants had a significant loss of income. Thank you for your faithfulness! Because you gave our Missionaries could continue to be supported and focus on the spiritual needs of their communities.

Perhaps this past year gave us a picture of what it might be like to be a **LINKS** Missionary. The only contact for many of us with our family and friends this past year was through platforms like Skype, Zoom, or Google Meets. This is everyday life for many of our Links missionaries. This past year our churches continued to support our Links missionaries, not only monetarily, but also through encouraging emails, cards, and gifts. Churches you were a most valued friend to our Links missionaries in 2020!

Just like everybody else our District NMI Council had to rethink our normal again and again. It would have been easier to just take a Gap year but that's not what we're called to do. We couldn't meet in person but Zoom meetings kept us connected! Each member of the council really owned their area of emphasis and promoted and encouraged our churches diligently. 5. District Missional Leadership Specialist

This is my 18th report to the Mid-Atlantic District Assembly. As I reflect on the report I submitted last year it heightened my awareness of how significantly my work has been impacted by the Pandemic. After the 1st week in March 2020 all of our training events for the remainder of the calendar year were canceled. While plenty of coaching and, eventually, individual in-person meetings took place, the lion's share of work took place alone or via Zoom, through email or texting. While there were plenty of opportunities to go "deeper" into leadership development with many, our ability to impact more broadly through larger group events disappeared entirely. I believe this is a temporary setback and sometime in the coming year we will be in the position to begin gathering together again to make disciples, form leaders, fellowship together, serve side by side and continue to be a blessing to our neighbors together as we had been prior to these weird days we're still living in.

It is often necessary to take a long view to accurately assess our impact and so at the risk of repeating myself here is an update to some of the information shared in my 2020 report. In the two and a half months starting 2020 we held two Local LEAD events at churches and one large multi-congregation event we called "Ephesians 4 Churches" in Central Pennsylvania allowing us to provide ministry leadership development training to a total of 127 additional lay leaders from eight different congregations. Now over 557 people have participated in this kind of training in the past ten years on our district with at least twelve of these people discovering a call to vocational ministry upon their lives and one has already been ordained and is preparing to become a lead pastor of one of our district churches. In addition, over 700 people have participated on some level in StrengthsFinder training helping them to gain deeper self-awareness of how they're equipped to serve God in their lives. In the past sixteen years 131 people were ordained into vocational ministry or had their credentials recognized in the Church of the Nazarene and 41 of these are women.

Church Planting continues and in the past sixteen years fifty new congregations have been planted and continue to serve their neighbors as witnesses for God's love and redemption. Twenty-two of these new works have been recognized as fully organized congregations in the Church of the Nazarene. One new plant has begun ministry this past year and as recently as December plans are underway for another new church in Baltimore County.

I persisted in mentoring, coaching and generally supporting all of the leaders who were interested in my help. I supported all district efforts which needed me, read many more books than usual in the time I'd previously spent driving hither and yon across the Mid-Atlantic District in order to meet with pastors, boards, staff teams, yadda yadda yadda.

It has been my distinct honor to serve with the Christ-like pastors & people all across our Mid-Atlantic District and, especially with my colleagues on district staff. I am a man rich in friends.

Leadership Enablement And Discovery Cohorts (LEAD) for lay leaders

The annual LEAD Event was inaugurated in 2012. At the annual LEAD Event lay people who have been recommended by their pastor are invited to spend a weekend receiving training & coaching to increase their self-awareness and enhance their capacities for leadership in the local church context where they are serving. Tools used during the training include the Strengths Finder assessment, Emotional Intelligence 2.0 assessment, team case study, working projects and individual coaching. From 2012 – 2018 there have been a total of 162 LEAD Alumni from across the Mid-Atlantic District.

Local-LEAD Events

Due to the effectiveness of the annual LEAD Events the Mid-Atlantic District staff have begun holding “Local-LEAD” events beginning in 2017. These events are streamlined LEAD events hosted by a local church where a greater number of individuals from a local church can participate in many of the components of the longer annual LEAD event at a lower cost and without having to travel. The Local-LEAD events are typically held all day on a Saturday and include district staff preaching in the local church in the Sunday worship. The event concludes with a meal together with the Local-LEAD participants and a wrap session in the early afternoon. Since the Local-LEAD inauguration in 2017 339 people have participated in Local-LEAD events on the Mid-Atlantic District.



With the arrival of the pandemic in 2020, we've challenged our church community to have two rally cries – "The church never closed!" & "We must look to the needs of others!" So, it has been a major focus for us to encourage and address needs in our church and our community. One major project has been Seeds of Hope, inspired by the contribution from our district. Round 1 was in the Summer, when we took that contribution and raised it 5 times. We used those funds to provide gift cards from local restaurants for first responders (health care professionals and law enforcement) in our local community. Round 2 was in the Fall, when we raised more funds to provide gift cards for our teachers and school administrators in our church community, as well as providing meals for teachers in 2 schools in our local community. Over the course of the pandemic, we've also partnered with 95.1 Shine FM and a high school in Edgewood to give out food to those in need, sponsored a 5K run to raise funds for a local ministry to the homeless, as well as fill "Tote Bags" for the Sunday Breakfast Mission in Delaware.

Even though we have not able been able to meet together in full, we emphasize that the church has never closed. God has blessed us to be able to provide online services, and eventually we brought back indoor services. One of the highlights was the addition of an outdoor service at our Pavilion during the "good weather" months, which our community loved! We'll be bringing this back, regardless of whether the pandemic is still an issue. Our pastoral staff, worship team, and multimedia crew have been HUGE in making this happen!

Two other brief highlights – One, our daycare ministry was able to stay open, which has been a major blessing to our local community. Two, during the year of COVID, we had several called to ministry. Three women have applied for local licenses this year, and we have two men who are working through a call to chaplaincy. We also have some teens who are feeling called to ministry.

2020 has been a difficult year, but God has been good! We give thanks for His blessings!

At the beginning of January last year our community food bank was serving 100 to 150 families once a month. Little did we know that in just a few months the world would be facing the largest pandemic in our lifetime. According to the Department of Labor, unemployment rates spiked from 1.7 million in February to 22.4 million by April. During this same time the needs from our neighbors who we serve at the food bank increased as well. We quickly moved from distributing food from once a month to meet this increased need, to twice a month and eventually to every Saturday. By July we were serving an average of 300 families every Saturday and the numbers have continued to increase into 2021.

In hind-site, it took a major step of faith to increase our monthly distributions to every week. There was no way we could keep up with the increased cost of food nor the added numbers of volunteers we would need to serve the growing need of our hungry neighbors. However, we trusted that God would join us in providing for those in need. We prayerfully sent out the message throughout our congregation and surrounding community that we needed increased funding and many more volunteers to partner with us in this effort. And then we watched in amazement as God has continued to provide. As the need has grown, so has the support from our own congregation and the surrounding community. People, organizations and government agencies have reached out to us with funding and volunteer support that has continued into the new year.

Through God's help, we have been able to serve our hungry neighbors and build new relationships and in-roads with people who we would never have been able to before. We give God praise for God's continued grace and opportunities to serve others.

What does it mean to be a community of faith in the midst of a pandemic? This year we were invited, like all churches, to respond to this question. As the pandemic began, we found ourselves struggling to grasp the magnitude of the pandemic; believing the we would soon find "normal" but as our hopes gave way to reality we found the flexibility that we have been practicing in the past years to be an asset. The "Seeds of Hope" initiative began by the district, became a year long investment in a local low-income health clinic; as we took weekly meals to the entire medical staff team expressing our appreciation for their tireless work on the "front line". The oddity of handing off bags to gloved and masked medical staff at the door (because we couldn't enter the facility) became "normal". Like so many things, "normal" came to describe thing that we would have never dreamed. Bible studies and small groups moved outside and online; a single congregation became three as we began extra worship services to allow for social distancing and to provide safe worship environments to as many as we can. Not only have we remained flexible in worship and discipleship; but we are reaching the end of the administrative "restructuring" work of the past few years. When we began this process a few years ago, our desire was to ensure that our church structure allowed us to operate as efficiently as possible to allow for the most effective ministry possible in and through our community of faith. Thankfully, the major period of adjustment is coming to an end; and we are already seeing the value of the changes that we have made.

What does it mean to be a community of faith in the midst of a pandemic? For The Cross, it means allowing God to do God's work in us, so that through us God can change the world.

As things became uncertain and meeting became untenable we recognized that we needed to focus on and pray for three key results to emerge out of 2020 and the Coronavirus pandemic thriving: (1) increase our technological capacity for the sake of clear, quality connection with our people (2) hire dynamic pastoral staff in two full time and two part time positions, and (3) maintain our income by engaging, thanking, and serving our generous, giving congregation.

These were our goals. If we could do these things, we sensed we could survive. God showed up in a mighty way to answer these prayers.

First, we cast a vision to the congregation to raise \$35,000 above and beyond tithes and offerings to make our online feed more clear, more dynamic, and more modern. The church responded by helping us fund this. Second, we hired Austin Lash (Worship Pastor) and Jake Roberts (Executive Pastor) as full time pastoral staff. They are young, educated, and dynamic. They bring a fresh perspective that calls us to new excellence for the next generation of emerging adults. We also hired Nan Jefferies and Liz Powers to discipleship roles. They are talented, devoted, and creative. All four are driving our vision in new ways. Third, we ended the year with nearly identical income in 2020 as we had in 2019. Our people were so faithful and generous to fund the mission God has called us to. We leveraged this to start new missional partnerships including with a church in Baltimore City, The Red Cross, and BeMore Caring. As a result, we are seeing people join us through the pandemic. New families are giving, growing, and joining us for the sake of our call. God has been faithful through a strenuous unplanned period, not simply for maintenance, but for thriving!

We have been able to make connections with people who would never step foot inside a church building and several people have thanked us for our livestream ministry because "their church did not have any online option for them". In addition to this, we had a dozen or so online small groups start up in our church including a church-wide prayer group that continues to gather via Zoom to pray together every Friday at noon! Our children and youth ministries also continue to find creative ways to engage with our children, teens and parents. Furthermore, our outreach to our community grew during this last year as we were able to partner with other local churches to help meet tangible needs within our community. Early on in the year when we were quarantined, several members of our church helped drive and deliver over 200 Care Packages with food, supplies and hygiene products to those in our community who were unable to leave their homes due to being sick, disabled or elderly. We also held 3 community food drives where we were able to pass out thousands of pounds of food and produce to approximately 2,000 people in our community and back in September, we also we able to pass out a 1,000 pairs of shoes, books and backpacks filled with school supplies for the children. We praise God for all that He has done and for what He will do next through our church!

It seemed like a refreshing bit of normalcy for our community. Kimberly and I got to meet a few hundred different people one-on-one and share a smile to go with their candy. It spoke the message we want to convey, "Hollywood Church of the Nazarene loves her community."





In the words of a dear lady in our church, Faith Lowe, who passed away the end of this year and left behind a legacy of what it means to serve others with the love of Jesus: "Hasn't this been a year? So thankful, I know who holds the future and I know He holds my hand."

One weekend, we hosted a musical group and speaker. Friday night, a couple came who had just relocated to the area. Saturday, they returned and before I could greet them, he said, "Pastor, I want to be saved!" Of course, we prayed right then with him and baptized him on the square on Sunday morning.

A few weeks later, as we were setting up for the service, the manager of the coffee and wine bar directly across from where we held service began a conversation with me with these words, "You know, I am not much into religion," and then proceeded, with tears in his eyes, to tell me of the brokenness of his family and how our time on the square was speaking comfort to his heart. He continued to join us until weather forced us inside. Our prayer is to be back on the square on Easter Sunday morning as a visible reminder of the presence of Christ in our community. One other amazing opportunity that God gave us has been the ability to engage with members of the homeless community who live a couple of blocks from our church. God truly did some amazing things, and we are looking forward to more as we plan to return to outdoor worship on the square on Easter morning.

This year for Melwood has been a year filled with blessings, learning, struggle, and yet through it all there are new things on the horizon. At the end of 2019 the Lord spoke to us as a church to focus on what God was going to do "NEXT" in our congregation, but little did we know what all that would mean. At the beginning of the year there were many different things that we had planned that would never be able to happen because of the restrictions we faced due to the pandemic. As we pivoted to online services and social gatherings we started to understand the true need the body had for being in fellowship together. Arranging ZOOM game nights, bible studies, prayer services, and various other gatherings became our new rhythm. Melwood took time to reach out to our surrounding neighborhoods as we saw the need for people to be out of the house. This lead to hosting movies on the front lawn of the church where people could sit in their cars or on the grass in a Drive-In style movie. Families were able to connect with the local church and forget some of the stresses that were happening at home. In the midst of learning a new life rhythm and reaching out to the neighbors, God called us into a deeper partnership with DC Urban Outreach. DC Urban Outreach quickly became a food distribution center in the 6th ward in SouthEast DC. In connection with other local churches we had the opportunity to prepare and distribute over to over 15,000 families last year. Tensions started to rise and as the social justice, race issues were mounting, we were able to connect with a local congregation Faith City and start quarterly prayer rallies where we would meet in various church parking lots crying out to God as the Body of Christ. These smaller prayer rallies lead to the development of an idea we had to gather more churches together for a day of worship and prayer. The planning began in July for 4 different churches who met to plan a day of worship in the local minor league baseball stadium. "One People United" held our first day of worship gathering in the Blue Crabs stadium where people from all over the area came to worship One God as One Body!

We don't like this period of dislocation any more than anyone else, but we're resting in the confidence that we're being prepared for the new types, forms, and needs of ministry that will present themselves in 2021.

This crisis has disrupted many churches; however, at the Haitian Church of the Nazarene, God has been great so far towards us. The church is growing at a significant rate, and we give thanks to God for his blessing upon us. The addition of two new pastors to our pastoral staff help us with the progress we are making so far. The new pastors are very involved, and they help keep our members uplift. In 2021, our goal is to continue to impact lives in our community and worldwide. .00 This past year at New Freedom Trail Church one of the things we were forced to do because of Covid-19 restrictions is stream our services. This meant a big learning curve for us and streaming did not always run smoothly. What began to happen however was an increase in the number of people who experienced our worship service. Stories began to come in from our members of family, friends, and neighbors that never went to any church before but who were now watching our stream. These people many of whom I have not met, were hearing the gospel, and being challenged to choose Jesus.

Every Thanksgiving, our church serves a meal to those in our community who are alone, or financially struggling. This year with the Covid-19 restrictions we almost decided to cancel this ministry. Instead of canceling, we decided to offer packaged meals with parking lot delivery. We believed this change might diminish the number of meals served but God had other ideas. Not only did we more than double the meals served but we also had a record number of volunteers from the community join the effort. We were able to minister to people who were elderly and stuck at home, care givers who were helping Covid-19 victims, and people who had lost their jobs due to the pandemic.

A third way in which we uniquely ministered during this past year was in finding a way to personally touch people who could not come out to church. Our associate pastor, Tom Davidson came up with the idea of delivering boxes to homes filled with activities and worship elements. We did this two times: Easter and Advent. We wanted people to be encouraged during a dark time and to enable them to worship with Trail Church in their home. The theme of these boxes was "God with us in the home". People told us that through the boxes they felt valued, touched, encouraged, and enabled to worship. It was amazing to hear about Advent candle lightings happening in homes as families looked for the coming of Jesus. I thank God that during this unusual time He has strengthened what remains and even touched us in new ways.

Utilizing the expertise of our educators we have been consulting with parents on how to manage online education through the disruption that has been caused. As a consequence we have seen spiritual growth and maturity develop in at least 8 of our young people.

Two single mothers have been given special care and financial assistance as well as food and spiritual guidance that has taken place and made a significant difference in their home life and in their spiritual development.

We provided food for four families in our two congregations, and gave 926 lbs. of non-perishable food items to the local food bank.

Through the internet our members are ministering regularly to people in Argentina, Bangladesh, Mexico, and Canada. This takes the form of in depth Bible studies, and classes, as well as fellowship, and evangelism.

An online Good News Club for elementary age children has led to children accepting Christ as savior. We follow up with parents seek to get the children into a local church.

With the leadership of Pastor Jose and Rocio Ortiz, the Spanish plant congregation has been kept stable and endured outbreaks of COVID from which all have recovered.

Since March 2020 we were able to study the entire Book of Romans, the entire Book of Ephesians, The Churches of the Apocalypse, and the Articles of Faith of the Nazarene manual, the average number of connections is 20 families per night, we have organized that a family runs each night The service and the leading brothers give the class, we have the Lord's Supper every month and we were able to do a Easter Service at 5 am incredible, beautiful, full of the power of God, Our parents had to live in catacombs because of the Persecution and not they stopped preaching the word, the Building does not limit the man of God, we with electronic resources are reaching thousands every night, in the catacombs due to the pandemic, but with the power of the word of GOD.

For the first time, we were encouraged to be more creative and minister to the people in different ways. So, we not only had to think outside the box, but we had to throw the box away and begin to stand in the unknown. And with that I thank the Lord for the Internet.

With the Covid restrictions in place, we had to resort to our media presence to continue meeting and ministering to our community. Our first online services consisted of a praise and worship time; broadcast live from my kitchen table followed by a message recorded earlier in the week; and it would be broadcast over Facebook and uploaded to YouTube. These services were a time of experimenting and learning as we discovered the ins and outs of Facebook Live and YouTube; overall I believe the people enjoyed this time and format. After the restrictions eased up, we began to live stream our entire service from the sanctuary. Throughout this time, we experimented with different equipment and setups; trying to find a method of streaming that was full proof. But nothing is fullproof.

Over the course of the year, we have seen a steady worship attendance, including online and in person viewership averaging 73 people each week who call this their church. But the tremendous thing I see is the number of new people viewing the services each week. Through word of mouth and members of our congregation sharing; we have been introduced to over 129 visitors to our services over the course of this year; averaging close to 73 visitors each week. We may not have grown in ways we are used to growing, but numerically we have had an impact on our world in ways we may never really know; and to that we thank the Lord.

This is my first report as Lead Pastor of LifeStream. Our church has done well navigating the pastoral transition period and the uncertainty of the pandemic. Volunteers and donors have stepped up to help us increase our digital reach through virtual ministries like streaming our worship service. We also have core groups meeting for Bible study over zoom. The Sundays we have not been able to meet in person, we have met over zoom for fellowship, prayer, and discussion. Our VBS went virtual as well with engaging videos and take-home activities. It has been encouraging to see and hear from one another over the digital platform.

We have also seen the need to increase opportunities for connection during a very isolating time. In addition to the virtual and streaming options discussed above, we challenged our congregation to be Note-Writers and not just Note-Thinkers. During this campaign we provided address labels and note cards while encouraging our church family to send a card, a text, or make a phone call when another church member crossed their mind. Our missions council has revived our meals ministry to support families suffering from illness or going through difficult circumstances by providing them meals.

Our leaders and volunteers have also ensured that the impact of our compassionate ministries could continue during the pandemic. The Wednesday food pantry has been open every week and new households are blessed through that ministry on a weekly basis. Realizing the importance of the meeting of support groups, the church building has remained open to our community groups: Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Alcoholics Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, and Classical Conversations. During Advent we collected gifts and stuffed stockings for individuals and families at a local women's shelter. Our Christmas Blessing sent a combined \$5,760 to Jamaica, our LINKS missionary, Lifestyles (a local non-profit), and covered the utility bills for a local family.

LifeStream continues to build connections and make an impact for Jesus!

After the COVID-19 pandemic began, and we were no longer able to personally minister at the Genesis Seaford Center, I was asked to provide a weekly message that is distributed to the residents and staff.

In December, God opened the door for our Church to bless others. We contributed \$1,500 to Samaritan's Purse for the Gospel Story that is included in the Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes with gifts for children. We also provided a small Christmas tree for each of the 100 residents and pastry trays for 90 medical and support staff at the Genesis Seaford Center.

In the midst of some of the most challenging days many of us have experienced, our focus is on God, who continues to sustain and strengthen us as we seek to live as people of faith and hope. We also continue to pray for our Church's ministry, and we are developing leaders who are committed to God's mission of making Christlike disciples in our community.

Psalm 34:10 says "Those who seek the Lord lack no good thing." This has certainly been proven true for us this past year. In addition to all that the pandemic brought, we also saw the departure of our beloved pastor, Dr. Phil Bolerjack, who was our shepherd for 19 years. There were definitely times of uncertainty, but as expected, God proved himself faithful in many ways. Like everyone else, we were finally pushed into utilizing more online technology both for streaming and social media; a goal we had been struggling to launch for sometime. In May, we launched our church app improving communication and online engagement with our people. We also realized a shift in our giving patterns with now more than half of our receipts being submitted online. Most of our people retained their employment and were then able to contribute to a COVID Relief Fund through which we have been able to help many with financial needs due to the crisis. Through our Latino congregants, we were able to secure a grant of \$10,000 to be used for those needing relief for rent, power, etc. Large amounts of food from the food bank were also received and distributed to needy families in our community. Sunday School classes mobilized to send much needed medical flow meters to hospitals in Honduras as well as financial support to other Latin American countries. Our NMI leaders coordinated financial gifts for struggling Nazarene pastors in Peru. Locally, we experienced some of the largest outreach efforts we've ever seen through our outdoor drive-thru CAR-nival which was open to the public at the end of October. Furthermore, we were able to launch a Living Drive-Thru Nativity. 110 volunteers contributed a total of over 1,000 hours to make this event happen. 900+ cars over 5 nights, and an estimated average of 2,200+ individuals from as far as Pennsylvania heard the message of the gospel. We are thankful for our partnership with Shine FM, and with the Gideon's Intl. who were able to handout around 600+ Bibles at the event. We give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind, offering sacrifice thank offerings, and telling of his works with songs of joy. (from Psalm 107:21-22)

In my reflections of 2020, I have been thinking about the themes of this past year, which form the "perfect number" of seven:

#1 - A New Challenge - I do not need to tell you that COVID-19 has been a challenge for all of us. And the challenge of this pandemic literally forced us into livestreaming immediately.

#2 - A New Property Acquisition - Although we started working on the purchase of our new property at 429 E. Orange Street before COVID-19, the challenge of completing this transaction during this pandemic was not insignificant. We were finally able to close officially on the property on September 15, 2020. We only missed our original deadline by 10 weeks.

#3 - A New Worship Location (Center) - For various reasons we chose to move the worship center to Building 429 on the first Sunday of January 2021. This move also gave us more space to be socially distant, and allowed our Daycare to keep their area more easily sanitized.

#4 - A New Lead Pastor - I will officially be stepping down as Lead Pastor on May 31, 2021, and the congregation elected Pastor Dale Detweiler as our next Lead Pastor. Pastor Dale and I are working for the next few months on a scaled transition.

#5 - A New Leadership Team - We have three new church board members that have joined our team this year. But also, new to this team will be a new Church Board Chair. Pastor Dale Detweiler will assume this position during our transition phase.

#6 - A New Chapter - The time has come for Pastor Dale to take the leadership reins. But one of the biggest transitions is yet to come, which is moving out of "pandemic mode" as a community, and into the new chapter of returning to worshipping together once again.

#7 - A Continued Call to Move Forward in Faith - By God's help, we have experienced a number of "faith steps" this year and we celebrate those steps. But the challenge for 2021 is to "continue to move forward in faith." This means, being faithful in prayer, fellowship, learning, discipleship, stewardship, but also in radical obedience to His leadership. Just as we started the process in faith led by God, we are challenged today to continue to "move forward in faith."

The pandemic ministry story that has truly been a blessing during this past year are the "care packages" that the church was able to provide to some of the many frontline workers in the area. These packages went to three different locations. The first location was Birch Manor, a rehab facility, where a group from the church prior to the pandemic would go and sing, give a message, and make a craft. The package included a gift and card for every resident and pizzas and drinks for the staff. In addition, to the care package the church also went and stood in the parking lot of the facility, encircled the building as best it could, and prayed scripture over the workers and residents. The second location was Sykesville Fire Department. This package included food, drinks, and other items, which was warmly received by those at the station. The third location was the Carroll County Sheriff's department, this package was even more meaningful because a local deputy is part of the church body. This was probably the biggest of all the packages as it included donations from multiple sources including local businesses. The pizza and snacks provided helped to feed all the deputies on two shifts at least twice!! The humbling part of this care package was the note the church received from the Sheriff, which read in part, "To say I'm humbled with your support is an understatement. We are so blessed to have the support and prayers of our faith based community. Gestures like this fuel us physically and spiritually."

Our hope is that this ministry outreach will extend well beyond the pandemic period and become one of the many ways to show the love of Jesus with those in the community. My prayer for this upcoming year is, Lord, I pray that you would help us all to show people that they are your beloved daughters and sons.

2020 was all about 3 words: Learning, Adapting, and Adjusting. Although we were not fully prepared for the pandemic, we were able to learn, adapt, and adjust. After a great baptism service where we had 3 people get baptized, we host Lenae Ross from Hope Rising to help her plant, as well as a great start of the year with spiritual disciplines, we went fully virtual from May 15th to July 5th. During this time, we learned how to stream our services, moved all of our groups to virtual, and began creating new ways to help the congregation feel connected while separate. We also had the privilege to partner with our local COAD as well as a neighboring church to start a pop up food pantry. In 2020, we hosted 27 food pantries, helped out an average of 40 families each time, as well as gave out over 5000 meals. We also started a COVID19 giving fund to help individuals and local business with bills, helped the local schoolhouse with groceries every Friday, and blessed 111 kids with our Christmas Angel Tree program.

During a year that we did not meet in person, we stopped counting any normal numbers, and we felt disconnected at times, I am confident that we remained the church that makes a difference. We attempted to learn the best ways we could still be the church, adapt new strategies to continue to live out the mission, and adjust what we used to do to work in our new normal.

- Townhomes – to bring the two church-owned townhomes up to DC code for the purpose of renting. Current Status: 1) Church roof and drains are repaired and working 2) 1st townhome is rented 3) 2nd is under construction 3) upper sanctuary is on hold through townhome construction.

Goal: To create revenue streams to use for refreshing and repurposing of property to use again for ministry in the neighborhood.

2. Refresh - To fix, organize, and clean the physical spaces.

Current Status: 1) In process of creating LLC with lawyers for rental property oversight 2)

Partnered with property manager to provide oversight of physical property and renters.

Goal: To maximize profit and ensure tax/legal obligations are correctly fulfilled.

3. Repurpose - To discover ways to use all spaces to serve the neighborhood of 16th Street Heights. Current Status: 1) Continual meetings with local people, organizations and government officials to discern strengths and needs in the community 2) Moving in direction of community partnerships with affordable housing, urban garden and cottage industry (kitchen).

Goal: To reshape the building to maximize its potential as hub for community development in Ward 4 of Washington DC.

4. Restart – To create space for start-up ministries and businesses to thrive.

Current status: Still dreaming.

Goal: To plant intercultural ministries in and out of the physical space of Mosaic.

During "normal times," we aired audio recordings of our messages, but now Facebook Live has expanded the reach of our witness. Technology has enabled us to worship God together with friends and family in state and out of state, believers and not-yet-believers--as well as some former attendees of our local congregation who have reconnected with us online. Our mid-week prayer meeting moved from in person to conference call to online video conference, and some attendees now join us who didn't usually participate when we met in person, because they don't have to drive and so the time commitment for those meetings is cut nearly in half. While our church building has been closed, we've also started two more mid-week meetings for women that have connected us to friends (and friends of friends) of our ladies.

Our ministry during the pandemic has been complicated by the fact that several members of our congregation cannot connect with us online for one reason or another. Additionally, undergoing most of this ordeal while in a pastoral transition has made a strange and uncomfortable season that much more difficult. But because God's people have gotten creative and persevered in their ministry, God's work in us and through us has continued. We are growing in faith as we discover and lean into the things that really matter.

Leadership Enablement And Discovery Cohorts (LEAD) for lay leaders

The annual LEAD Event was inaugurated in 2012. At the annual LEAD Event lay people who have been recommended by their pastor are invited to spend a weekend receiving training & coaching to increase their self-awareness and enhance their capacities for leadership in the local church context where they are serving. Tools used during the training include the Strengths Finder assessment, Emotional Intelligence 2.0 assessment, team case study, working projects and individual coaching. From 2012 – 2018 there have been a total of 162 LEAD Alumni from across the Mid-Atlantic District. The River Church of the Nazarene in Berlin, Maryland has hosted all of these events and this congregation has been an outstanding partner in making this ministry possible and so successful.

Local-LEAD Events

Due to the effectiveness of the annual LEAD Events the Mid-Atlantic District staff have begun holding “Local-LEAD” events beginning in 2017. These events are streamlined LEAD events hosted by a local church where a greater number of individuals from a local church can participate in many of the components of the longer annual LEAD event at a lower cost and without having to travel. The Local-LEAD events are typically held all day on a Saturday and include district staff preaching in the local church in the Sunday worship. The event concludes with a meal together with the Local-LEAD participants and a wrap session in the early afternoon. Since the Local-LEAD inauguration in 2017, 466 people have participated in Local-LEAD events on the Mid-Atlantic District. Over 700 Mid-Atlantic District lay-leaders & volunteers have now experienced training in our LEAD Events.







In planning and performing our audit of the financial statements of the Mid-Atlantic District Church of the Nazarene (the Organization) as of and for the year ended January 31, 2020, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered the Organization's internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Organization's internal controls.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be material weaknesses. Given these limitations, during our audit, we did not identify any deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be material weaknesses. However, material weaknesses may exist that have not been identified.

We would like to take this opportunity to express our appreciation for the assistance provided to us by your staff during our audit, and look forward to working with you in the future. This communication is intended solely for the information and use of management, the Board of Directors, others within the organization, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

3. Finance Committee

In order to properly finance our global and district ministries, we present the following resolutions. The premise on which these are based is the pattern of tithes and offerings, which we teach our people as proper biblical stewardship. The basic principle will be 10% plus missions.

Funding The Mission

1. That each local organized church:
 - a. Give 5.5 percent of its current adjusted income to the District Ministries (which includes all District Auxiliaries i.e. NMI {.225%}, SDMI {.225%}, and NYI {.225%});
 - b. Give 2.25 percent of its current adjusted income to Pensions and Benefits;
 - c. Give 2.25 percent of its current adjusted income to Eastern Nazarene College;
 - d. Give a minimum of 5.5 percent of its current adjusted income to the World Evangelism Fund;
 - e. Send all funds given for District Ministries (including the NMI, SDMI, and NYI auxiliaries), Pensions & Benefits, and Eastern Nazarene College to the district treasurer for distribution; and
 - f. Send the World Evangelism Fund and other Global Mission Special dollars to the general treasurer through the online giving tools at www.fundingthemission.org or mail them to the general treasurer at PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184.
2. That until a church is officially organized, each church plant give 10% of its current adjusted income, which will be divided between World Evangelism Fund, Pensions & Benefits, Education {ENC}, District Ministries, and the three District Auxiliaries. These funds should all be sent to the district treasurer who will distribute the funds to the various entities.
3. That current adjusted income for local organized churches and church plants includes all funds which are charitable contributions, less the amount paid to World Evangelism Fund, Ten Percent Mission Specials, District Missional Ministry pledges and other specials that have been approved.
4. That all local organized churches and church plants send their 10% to the district treasurer by the 10th of each month.
5. That a special pledge will be received at the 2021 District Assembly and that it be designated to go to church plants, and other urban and multicultural missions on the district.

District Finance

6. That the district superintendent receive:
 - a. One month, or 5 weeks for serving within the denomination 20-29 years, or 6 weeks for serving 30 or more years, vacation with pay.

- b.* Reimbursement for Social Security, and health insurance in compliance with the Affordable Care Act.
 - c.* Reimbursement for all district-related expenses including district and denominational conventions, recruitment trips, preachers' meetings, and travel expenses.
 - d.* That the district provide to the district superintendent a tax-sheltered annuity as part of his/her compensation package, the amount to be determined by the district superintendent.
 - e.* Premium coverage for disability insurance as developed by the General Board of the Church of the Nazarene.
 - f.* That the district provide to the district superintendent a housing allowance as part of his/her compensation package, the amount to be determined by the district superintendent.
 - g.* A sabbatical leave, similar to the proposal for local pastors.
7. District journals:
- a.* That the district secretary will make available a "PDF" copy of the district journal to each local organized church and each church plant.
 - b.* That each church and church plant distribute the journal to their officers and church leaders either in "PDF" form or in printed form.
8. That the cost of the annual Pastors' and Spouses' Retreat, less the pastors' and spouses' lodging and meals, be included in the District Budget.
9. That the interest from all interest bearing accounts, except designated funds, be applied to the Church Extension Fund (CEF).
10. That the district financial records be reviewed each year by a qualified accountant within six months of the district assembly with the accountant's report becoming part of the next year's district minutes and that the auxiliary records and Williamson Bible Institute be reviewed by a District Auditing Committee.
11. That the travel allowance for volunteer district business be based on one half the current IRS rate (rounded up to the whole cent), plus tolls, meals, and lodging if necessary.
12. That the salaries and expense accounts in the District Budget be paid on the basis of the district fiscal year.
13. That the District Advisory Board ensure the following matters:
- a.* Provide for a district missional resource center.
 - b.* Receive (all money) from the sale of properties of disorganized churches, less encumbrances and costs for deposit in the Church Planting Fund (50%) and CEF (50%).
 - c.* On request, provides local churches with guidance for auditing their financial books.
 - d.* Maintain and Administer a pastors' benevolence fund to assist pastors in personal emergency situations.
 - e.* That any district line item balances at the end of the statistical year be used at the discretion of the District Advisory Board.
 - f.* That all financial matters not provided for in this report be referred to the District Advisory Board for consideration and action throughout the assembly year.

14. That the District Finance Committee review the financial statements of each church with a mortgage on a quarterly basis.
15. That the chair of the Assembly Finance Committee appoint a Ministerial Support subcommittee to recommend to the district assembly guidelines for the local churches' support of pastors, pastoral assistants, and evangelists.
16. That no district board, committee or other entity shall overspend their district budget line item(s) limit without the prior authorization of the District Advisory Board.

Local Finance

17. We recommend that each local church:
 - a. Adopt Basic Local Church Financial Policies based on the template detailed in Appendix E.
 - b. Be encouraged in the stewardship of its possessions as this relates to wills, annuities, and life loans on behalf of the church, with special emphasis on missions and education; and we encourage every church to utilize the Church of the Nazarene Foundation to facilitate planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments, or charitable trusts. (Visit www.NazareneFoundation.org or call 866-273-2549.)
 - c. Provide an annual emphasis on storehouse tithing.
 - d. Make an annual contribution to the American Bible Society, the Nazarene Bible College, and the Nazarene Theological Seminary.
 - e. Prepare and adopt an annual comprehensive budget and monitoring system in compliance with the *Manual* ¶129.6-129.7, which shall include denominational allocations; that the tithes and offering amount be sufficient to supplement all special offerings in the budget; that pastors promote support of the tithes and offering items; and that a special attempt be made to meet the budget at least on a monthly basis.
 - f. Adopt a unified treasury system with all funds in the church account; and that each church treasurer present complete written financial reports including departmental records, balance analysis, year-to-date charts, and denominational allocation status reports to each monthly board meeting. (*Manual* ¶136.3-136.4)
 - g. Consider unpaid monthly denominational allocation payments as outstanding accounts to be paid in full before the end of the statistical year.
 - h. Retain financial records according to the guidelines supplied by the district auditing committee and records should be periodically reviewed by an external entity.
 - i. Permit records be open at all times to examination by the pastor.
 - j. Use the services of a banking system, where all accounts are in the name of the church, and that payments are made by the church only.
 - k. That the District Missional Resource Center provide for each church,

guidelines for their church insurance programs.

- I. That each pastor explore the availability of matching funds through industries of employees contributing to our college, that the use of such matching funds be in strict compliance with the policies of the companies and Eastern Nazarene College, and the pastors secure the printed policies of the companies and Eastern Nazarene College as guidelines.

 - a. Give 5.5 percent of its current adjusted income to the District Ministries (which includes all district auxiliaries i.e. NMI {.225%}, SDMI {.225%}, and NYI {.225%});

 - c. Give 2.25 percent of its current adjusted income to Eastern Nazarene College;
 - d. Give a minimum of 5.5 percent of its current adjusted income to the World Evangelism Fund;
 - e. Send all funds given for District Ministries (including NMI, SDMI, and NYI auxiliaries), Pensions & Benefits, and Eastern Nazarene College to the District Treasurer for distribution; and
 - f. Send the World Evangelism Fund and Ten Percent Mission Special dollars to the General Treasurer through the online giving tools at www.fundingthemission.org or mail them to the General Treasurer at PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184.
2. That each church plant give 10% of its current adjusted income, which will be divided between World Evangelism Fund, Pensions & Benefits, Education {ENC}, District Ministries, and the three District Auxiliaries. These funds should all be sent to the District Treasurer who will distribute the funds to the various entities.
3. That income for local organized churches and church plants includes all funds which are charitable contributions, less the amount paid to World Missions, Ten Percent Mission Specials, District Missional Ministry pledges and other specials that have been approved.
4. That all local organized churches and church plants send their 10% to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.



**Mid-Atlantic District Church of the Nazarene

Every local church on the Mid-Atlantic District is asked to give 5.5 percent of its current income to the District Ministries (which includes all district allocations, and NMI, SDMI, and NYI); 5.5 percent of its income to the World Evangelism Fund; 2.25 percent to Pensions and Benefits; and 2.25 percent to Eastern Nazarene College. This amount totals 15.5% of the present income. This philosophy is based on the same proportionate giving we teach our people, which is to give a tithe plus missions.

(Note: Mid-Atlantic District approved church plants are asked to give 10% of their current income as allocations, which will be divided between World Evangelism Fund, Pensions & Benefits, Education {ENC}, District Ministries, and the three District Auxiliaries. These funds should all be sent to the District Treasurer who will distribute the funds to the various entities.)

Income for local churches [and church plants] includes all funds which are charitable contributions, **less the amount paid to World Missions, Ten Percent Mission Specials, District Missional Ministry pledges** and other specials that have been approved.

So, the plan looks like this:

At the end of each month:

- Figure your total income for that month
- Subtract those dollars sent to the General Treasurer for World Evangelism Fund
- Subtract those dollars sent in for Mission Approved Specials
- Subtract those dollars sent to the District Treasurer for the District's Missional Ministry Pledge
- Subtract those dollars considered "in and out" monies

10% of that adjusted income is to be sent directly to the **Mid-Atlantic District Treasurer, 108 Central Avenue, Glen Burnie, MD 21061** by the 10th of the following month:

Our District Treasurer will distribute that 10% to the following:

- District SDMI
- District NYI
- District NMI
- District Ministries
- Pensions & Benefits

- Eastern Nazarene College

5.5 % of that adjusted income is to be sent to the **General Treasurer through the online giving tools at www.fundingthemission.org**, or mail it to the **General Treasurer, Global Treasury Services, PO Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184** by the 10th of the following month. (For approved church plants, your 10% is to be sent to the Mid-Atlantic District Treasurer, who will in turn distribute the amount between the various entities **INCLUDING World Evangelism Fund**)

AN ILLUSTRATION:

If your church receives \$10,000.00 in “charitable receipt income” in the month of April 2017, **BUT** \$1,000.00 of that amount was Easter Offering dollars:

\$10,000.00
- 1,000.00 (<i>because you will be sending this to the General Treasurer</i>)
\$9,000.00 would be the income on which 15.5% would be based

This means:

10% of \$9,000.00 = \$900.00. This amount is to be sent to the District Treasurer to fund P&B, ENC, District Ministries, and all District Auxiliaries.

5.5% of \$9,000.00 = \$495.00 is to be sent to the General Treasurer for the World Evangelism Fund.

HOWEVER, SINCE \$1,000.00 is designated as Easter Offering, that amount (\$1,000.00) should be sent to the Global Ministry Center marked World Evangelism Fund , Easter Offering (because the Easter Offering is part of WEF). So, you would have overpaid WEF for April by \$505.00.

BUT PLEASE NOTE:

The \$505.00 goes toward your yearly total of 5.5% – so, if your May income was still \$10,000.00 you would not need to send in the full \$550.00. You would only need to send in \$45.00. Total income for April and May = \$20,000 - \$1,000 = \$19,000 x 5.5% = \$1,045; you sent in \$1,000 in April, so you only need to send in \$45 in May.

The purpose of the Ministerial Support Committee is to encourage each church's affirmation and care of its minister(s) and his/her family. Support of the minister by the church is an expression of the belief in the call of God on the minister's life. This report is to provide guidelines to churches for good stewardship in compensating their ministerial staff.

We believe that the churches should expect spiritual and administrative leadership from their ministerial staff, and that they are in turn responsible to provide their ministerial staff with an adequate living and contribute to a respectable retirement. We also believe that the salary and support of the ministerial staff should be the first priority in every church's financial obligations.

We recommend that the church board or an appropriately assigned committee review all pertinent portions of this report in preparation for the annual budget meeting.

I. General Considerations

1. That each church strives toward the goal of employing its lead pastor on a full-time basis.
2. For reference, the total salary and benefits package for all church staff (pastoral and support) is suggested to be no more than 45-50% of Total Income in the Operational Budget.
3. That church boards review pastor and pastoral staff compensation at least once a year with consideration given to both (1) merit increase, and (2) increase for cost of living. It is important to note that failure to provide a cost-of-living increase to the pastor actually results in a salary reduction equal to the inflation experienced during the year in question. This is why cost-of-living and merit increases should be simultaneously considered.
 - a. The total package, salary and benefits such as housing allowance, insurance and social security (self-employment tax), should be analyzed.
 - b. If this analysis shows that an increase is needed, especially in the area of salary, that a reasonable plan of raises and/or benefit increases may be instituted to bring the total compensation package to a suitable level.

The local church board secretary shall notify the district office of any decrease in any pastor's compensation-including the reasons for the decrease in salary.

4. All guidelines must be followed in conformity with Internal Revenue Service regulations.
5. That when a church cannot support a salary and benefits package that meets the financial needs of their pastor, they allow their pastor to be bi-vocational with their permission and blessing. The pastor should be allowed to work enough hours outside the church to meet his or her financial needs. Pastors should not consider working more hours than necessary to

meet their financial needs. Churches should only take into consideration compensation for pastoral services.

II. Compensation Package Recommendations

6. That our churches be guided in setting the lead pastor's minimum cash salary by the following formula: 20 percent of the amount "Raised for All Purposes" up to \$100,000 + 7 percent of the excess above \$100,000.
 - a. Example: First Church of the Nazarene raises \$450,000 for all purposes for the year. (They also have a daycare that raises an additional \$300,000 in income.) The minimum amount is determined first by calculating 20% of 100,000. (This amount is \$20,000). Then, calculate 7% of the remaining \$350,000. (This amount is \$24,500.) Add these together (\$20,000 + \$24,500) to get the minimum cash salary, which would be \$44,500. (Note: You do not figure income from a daycare into this calculation.)
7. Consideration should be given that compensation should reflect the pastor's position within the local church and within the community. Compensation should also reflect the length of experience, level of education, demonstration of capability, productivity, length of service, and level of successful leadership in the management of the local church.
8. That each church provides housing for all full-time pastoral staff. Realizing that a home is one element of retirement, we encourage churches to adopt one of the following options:
Option One — Establishment by the church board of a monthly housing allowance. To implement the housing allowance method, we recommend consideration for the following guidelines:
 - a. The following items should be included in the calculations:
 - (1) Mortgage payment
 - (2) Insurance
 - (3) Utilities
 - (4) Property taxes
 - b. Provide for assistance with down payment and closing costs. Government regulations may allow for no-interest loans to be made. Please check with your particular state.
 - c. Funding possibilities to enable a church to change from providing a parsonage to providing a housing allowance include:
 - (1) The sale of the present parsonage(s) (refer to *Manual* paragraph 104) and the investment of the proceeds from the sale in an investment fund to generate revenue for the housing allowance.
 - (2) The pastor may want to buy the parsonage. If so, the church can establish the Housing allowance, the pastor obtains a loan; the church invests the proceeds and pays the housing allowance to the pastor, who in turn pays the mortgage payments.
Option Two — The church provides housing for all full-time pastoral staff in the form of a parsonage and utilities. Realizing that housing is a key element for the retirement years, the church will pay into the full-time staff person's equity housing fund. It is important that you follow IRS guidelines in setting up this fund. We recommend the following for this fund:
 - a. A fund would be established for each full-time staff member.
 - b. The fund would follow the full-time staff member from church to church.
 - c. Each church should consider an annual amount of \$1,500 to \$2,500 for the equity fund.

This option would enable the local church to keep a parsonage, while enabling the fulltime staff to develop a fund for retirement housing.

9. In all cases, the housing component of the pastoral compensation packages should be discussed between the pastor and the church board to maximize allowable Internal Revenue Service tax exclusions. When structuring the package for housing allowance for example, the following should not only be evaluated from the standpoint of compensation but also based on the tax impact.
 - a. Full rent or mortgage payment
 - b. Insurance (both property and contents)
 - c. Property taxes
 - d. Improvements
 - e. Furnishings: purchase and repairs
 - f. Utilities and homeowner's association dues
 - g. Cleaning supplies
 - h. Repairs, maintenance, and remodeling to home
 - i. Landscaping
 - j. Alarm systems
 - k. Internet
 - l. Cable or Satellite Television
10. That each church reimburses all pastoral staff for their full Social Security tax, and that the reimbursement payments are made at least quarterly or proportionately with each salary check.
11. The annual SECA tax rate for the self-employed pastor is 15.3 percent. The formula for figuring the pastor's Social Security is:

a. Pastor's annual cash salary:	\$ _____
b. Add housing and/or fair rental value of parsonage:	\$ _____
c. Total of <i>a</i> and <i>b</i> :	\$ _____
d. Multiply by .153:	\$ _____
e. Divide by .847:	\$ _____
f. This amount equals the Social Security:	\$ _____

III. Insurance Considerations

12. We recommend that each church work with their pastoral staff to provide the best health insurance coverage possible. If the pastor chooses to use the Federal or State Exchanges in acquiring health insurance, please be aware of the ever-changing rules and regulations in how the church is or is not permitted to cover this cost. You may contact the district treasurer for additional guidance.
 - a. Churches that employ retired ministers as paid staff are encouraged to give consideration to covering the cost of providing supplemental health insurance but be sure to follow the current Federal and State guidelines.
 - b. When considering health insurance, dental insurance should not be overlooked.
13. Churches are strongly encouraged to provide term life insurance for their pastor and pastoral staff.
 - a. By participating in the district-arranged term life insurance, paying the premium out of the local church budget. The district will arrange for basic term life insurance for all assigned ministers and full-time ministerial staff who are on the payroll of churches for the Mid-Atlantic District Church of the Nazarene. Churches providing

this coverage are requested to pay the premium on an annual basis to the district treasurer upon receiving the invoice. Premiums for those ministers employed by the district and for senior pastors serving organized churches or church plants whose total church income is less than \$40,000, line 32 on the APR (Annual Pastor's Report), and for active evangelists (those holding six or more revivals in the previous year) will be paid out of the Ministerial Resource Fund.

- b.* By some other option at an equal amount of coverage or more. The district coverage amount should be considered a minimum.
- 14. That each church considers adoption of the general church's income protection plan (disability insurance) and accidental death and dismemberment insurance plan. That it be recognized as a Christian responsibility to give the pastor sick leave with full pay up to 90 days, and that if the illness continues longer, the termination of the leave should be determined by the local church board in consultation with the District Superintendent.
- 15. That each church should provide a professional liability rider on the church insurance policy for the pastor/staff.

IV. Reimbursable Expenses

- 16. That the following professional expenses incurred on official church business, and not reimbursed by the district or other sources, be reimbursed through an accountable plan for all pastoral staff:
 - a.* Entertainment: home & restaurants (housing church guests, etc.)
 - b.* Business Meals
 - c.* Ministry-related gifts (wedding, baby, etc.) and Benevolent gifts
 - d.* Assemblies, conventions, continuing education expenses: registration fees, air/train/bus/car rental, lodging/tips/laundry, meals and tips
- 17. That the local church provides an auto reimbursement:
 - a.* Through an accountable reimbursement plan at the current IRS-accepted mileage rate per business mile (such plan should meet the minimum reporting requirements as set forth by the U.S. tax code).
 - b.* Or provides a church-owned and maintained vehicle for the pastor's use.
- 18. That the moving expenses of incoming pastoral staff be paid by the local church, including taxes on automobile and other taxable property (when applicable), and to give an amount equal to an extra week's salary for miscellaneous expenses for relocation. Consideration should be made for the moving expenses of a retiring pastor and incoming part-time staff.
- 19. That each church remembers the pastoral staff and families with a generous Christmas gift (e.g., one week's cash salary).
- 20. That the church provides a comfortable and well-equipped office/study for the pastor's use. This provision should include necessary equipment such as a phone and computer (with internet access), and all necessary supplies, postage, and office administrative help as needed.

V. Retirement Considerations

- 21. That each church fund a tax-sheltered annuity for pastoral staff, in addition to their cash salary, in an amount equal to at least 5 percent (a minimum of \$500 per year and not to exceed the maximum amount allowable by law) of the pastor's annual cash salary, using The Pensions and Benefits USA Supplement Retirement Plan or equivalent.

22. That each church pay their allocation to the District Missional Resource Center in order to fulfill the Pensions and Benefits Allocation that will assure maximum retirement and life insurance benefits for their pastor from Pensions and Benefits USA.

VI. Other Benefits

23. That all ministers on the church staff be granted vacation with salary and pulpit supply paid by the church. That dates scheduled for vacation be set at the minister's discretion with approval of the lead pastor and/or the church board. A full vacation week is to include seven consecutive days. That vacation time shall be based on the following formula:
- a. At least two weeks for pastors serving the denomination for the first four years
 - b. At least three weeks for pastors serving the denomination for 5 to 9 years
 - c. At least four weeks for pastors serving the denomination for 10 to 19 years
 - d. At least five weeks for pastors serving the denomination for 20 to 29 years
 - e. At least six weeks for pastors serving the denomination for 30 or more years

It is recommended that each pastor and associate(s) adopt the church year for the purpose of scheduling vacation time. Vacation time should not accumulate from year to year without the approval of the church board. Time spent at district and general church functions should not be counted as vacation or time off because attendance at these functions is part of the pastor's official duties.

24. That all paid ministers on the church staff be granted at least 3 weeks paternity paid leave or 6 weeks maternity paid leave. Volunteer staff should be offered the same leave times. In cases of adoption we recommend that the local church initiate conversation with the pastoral family as to what might be appropriate and helpful due to the variety of types of adoptions, (i.e. foster care adoptions, overseas adoptions, etc.)
25. That each church encourages all pastoral staff to enrich their ministerial training by providing funds to permit them to engage in some form of advanced or continuing education, such as ministerial conventions, seminars, directed studies, special college and seminary courses, the purchase of professional development materials and the payment of professional dues.
26. That each church, recognizing the intensity of duties on the Lord's day, insist that their pastors take at least one full day off each week or its equivalent for worship and rest. Since this is not always possible, we recommend that the day off be carried over. Personal time should be taken at a time of the pastors' own choosing and is in addition to national holidays. In addition, the church board should be sensitive to particularly stressful time periods, and grant additional time off as needed.
27. That churches consider granting the pastors times away for rest, renewal, prayer, and spiritual growth. In addition, we recommend that the pastors be given at least one week off each year for study. This would not be a vacation but a serious means of strengthening the minister and their service. No minister can keep high standards without planned and consistent learning. This could include attendance at a minister's workshop, class or any Lifelong Learning opportunity.
28. The church board should provide leadership in organizing and implementing daily prayer on behalf of their pastors and families.
29. That each local church organizes a board committee to assist in improving and facilitating care of the pastoral staff. The committee shall pray for and encourage the pastoral staff and their families in every way possible. It shall be the duty of the committee to oversee and facilitate all special and seasonal expressions of love given to the pastoral staff and their families. They are also to be aware of and coordinate practical ways of assisting the pastoral staff and their families (e.g. provision for child care for church retreats, conventions, and

- assemblies, etc.) and help find ways as a church to minister to the children of the pastors and staff.
30. That considering the high rate of stress ministry places on clergy couples and families, each church should encourage and enable its ministers to attend periodic marriage enrichment retreats, and/or family retreats paying all expenses if possible, and not consider this as vacation time.
 31. That our churches, wherever possible, establish a fund to pay expenses of their pastoral staff and spouse(s) to attend evangelism conferences, general assembly, District Pastors' & Spouse Retreat, and other district, regional, and general conferences and retreats.

VII. Pastoral Sabbath Rest

32. Members of the ministerial staff should take a Sabbath rest to, among other things, prevent burn-out and provide time for reflection, leadership renewal, and spiritual growth. The church board is encouraged to initiate discussion about a Sabbath rest with their pastors. Sabbath rest is a time to be renewed and nurtured, to dig deeper into one's relationship with God. The concept of Sabbath rest is a cyclical season of renewal for the minister and the ministry that is modeled by God following creation and by Jesus as he took his disciples on retreat following intense times of mission.
33. The congregation should consider a Sabbath rest for any lead pastor and full-time pastoral staff members who have served five consecutive years with that congregation and every fifth year thereafter. The sabbatical should be a minimum of four to six weeks and should be scheduled by considering the needs of the congregation, the requirements of the pastor's proposal, and any other pertinent concerns. The sabbatical should not reduce the time allotted for continuing education or regular vacations. The pastor should continue to receive full salary and retirement benefits including insurance, social security, and travel and entertainment allowances during the sabbatical period. In addition, a stipend may also be provided at the discretion of the board after consideration of the pastor's proposal.
34. The Process: The church board and the pastor will form a Sabbatical Committee to develop a written proposal for presentation to the church board at least six months prior to the beginning of the desired sabbatical. The proposal shall include the focus of the sabbatical, travel plans, a communication plan, and a listing of the church tasks to be cared for in the absence of the pastor. No personnel changes shall be made without consulting the pastor and no two members of the pastoral staff may be on sabbatical leave at the same time except by permission of the church board.
35. The pastor and the Sabbatical Committee will each prepare a written report and submit it to the church board within the first three months after he or she returns. A copy of each of the reviews will also be forwarded to the District Superintendent for his information and review.
36. We recommend that pastors give themselves ample time to pray and prepare for the sabbatical before engaging a Sabbath Rest Committee to develop a plan. The pastor should consult a mentor or other trusted advisor and ask for congregational and church board assistance to identify program resources and assist in developing a proposal. Be careful to recognize any extra expenses that may be incurred during the sabbatical and plan to keep a daily journal.

37. Several questions can guide preparation: What do I want to happen to me personally? How do I want the sabbatical to affect my family/spouse? How might the congregation benefit?

VIII. Action Items

38. That the Ministerial Support Subcommittee plan and implement a seminar as a part of TEAM Day and recommend knowledgeable finance and tax consultants available to assist the pastors, church treasurers and the church's financial committees and/or trustees in financial areas, income tax management and retirement planning for the pastor.
39. That the Ministerial Support Committee report be emailed to all pastors and/or church board secretaries in time to be discussed in a fall board meeting. The church board needs to reply back to the district secretary any action that was taken.

IX. Benevolence

40. Those churches that are able should give material assistance at Christmas to other pastors and their families who are in need. Churches should contact the District Superintendent for the names of those pastors and staff members who need such assistance.
41. That churches honor retired pastors, evangelists, and missionaries (and their spouses) who are a part of their congregation by remembering them appropriately on their birthdays, wedding anniversary, Christmas, etc. Churches that are able should give financial assistance and also help the above attend district assembly, pastors and spouse retreat, etc.

IX. Evangelist's Support

42. That each church upon calling an evangelist provide remuneration in an amount equal to twice the pastor's weekly cash salary for the number of Sundays of the meeting; that consideration be given to reimbursing travel expenses and health insurance premium; that proportional reimbursement be given for Social Security tax; and that the amount of remuneration be communicated to the evangelist before the meeting.
43. That each evangelist called by a local church, within the present church year, be remembered at Christmas with a cash gift.
44. That each local church which has a commissioned evangelist who supports that church with tithes and offerings consider helping the evangelist with expenses to each evangelism conference and general assembly; and that the district consider helping each commissioned evangelist on its rolls with expenses to each conference on evangelism and general assembly.

X. Pulpit Supply

45. We recommend that retired ministers be employed for pulpit supply as frequently as possible. Retired ministers live on limited retirement benefits and may welcome the opportunity to provide pulpit supply. Retired ministers are a source of experience and expertise that should be utilized by the local church.
46. A minimum amount for pulpit supply should be \$75.00 to \$150.00 plus consideration of travel expenses.

Appendix D – Ministerial Support Short Form

The local church should support its ministerial staff to affirm the call of God on the minister's life. Churches should expect spiritual and administrative leadership from their ministerial staff, and should provide an adequate living and contribute to a respectable retirement. Please consult the Ministerial Support Committee report, Appendix C in the Mission Advance booklet or contact the District Advisory Board for more information on any specific items below.

I. General Considerations & Compensations Package Recommendations

- Strive to employ the lead pastor on a full-time basis.
- The total salary and benefits package for all church staff (pastoral and support) should be no more than 45-50% of Total Income in the Operational Budget.
- Review pastoral staff compensation at least once a year to consider both merit and cost of living increases.
- Use the following formula to determine the lead pastor's minimum cash salary: 20 percent of funds Raised for All Purposes up to \$100,000 + 7 percent above that amount. See Appendix C for reference.
- Consider other factors when setting compensation, including the pastor's position within the local church and community; experience, level of education, demonstration of capability, productivity, and length of service in the local church.
- Provide housing for all full-time pastoral staff, either by establishing a monthly housing allowance or by providing a parsonage.
- A housing allowance must conform to Internal Revenue Service regulations, and should consider costs of a mortgage payment, insurance, utilities, and property taxes.
- If a parsonage is provided, the church should pay into an equity housing fund that conforms to IRS guidelines. The fund would follow the full-time staff member from church to church, enabling the full time staff to develop a fund for retirement housing.
- Discuss the housing component of the pastoral compensation packages with the pastor to maximize allowable Internal Revenue Service tax exclusions, such as full rent or mortgage payment, insurance, property taxes, improvements, furnishings, utilities, health and dental expenses, etc.
- Reimburse all pastoral staff for their full Social Security tax with payments made at least quarterly or proportionately with each salary check.
- Affirm and bless bi-vocational ministry if unable to support a salary and benefits package that meets the pastor's financial needs. Pastors should consider working only enough hours to meet their financial needs.

II. Insurance Considerations

- Work with pastoral staff to provide the best insurance coverage possible including health, term life, disability, and professional liability.

III. Reimbursable Expenses

- Reimburse expenses incurred by pastoral staff on official church business—such as meals, mileage, ministry-related gifts, and moving expenses through an accountable plan.
- Remember pastoral staff and families with a generous Christmas gift.
- Provide a comfortable and well-equipped office or study for the pastor's use.

IV. Retirement Considerations

- Fund a tax-sheltered annuity for pastoral staff, in addition to their cash salary, in an amount equal to at least 5 percent (a minimum of \$500 per year and not to exceed the maximum amount allowable by law) of the pastor's annual cash salary, using Pensions and Benefits USA Supplement Retirement Plan or equivalent.
- Pay 10% of their current adjusted monthly income to the District Missional Resource Center to fulfill the Pensions and Benefits Allocation.

V. Other Benefits

- Grant vacation with full salary. Vacation time should not accumulate from year to year without approval of the church board. Time spent at district and general church functions should not be counted as vacation. A full vacation week should include seven consecutive days and the number of weeks given for vacation should increase according to years of service.
- Grant all paid ministers on the church staff at least three weeks paid paternity leave or six weeks paid maternity leave. Volunteer staff should be offered the same leave times. Initiate conversations with the pastoral family to determine the appropriate time needed to complete an adoption process.
- Encourage all pastoral staff to enrich their ministerial training by providing funds to engage in some form of advanced or continuing education.
- Insist that pastors take at least one full day off each week for worship and rest.
- Organize and implement daily prayer on behalf of pastors and families.
- Consider organizing a board committee to facilitate care of the pastoral staff, including prayer for the pastoral staff and their families
- Encourage and enable full-time ministers to attend periodic marriage enrichment retreats, paying all expenses, and not consider this as vacation time.
- Wherever possible, establish a fund to pay expenses of pastoral staff and spouse(s) to attend retreats such as evangelism conferences and other district, regional, and general conferences and retreats.

VI. Pastoral Sabbath Rest

- Recognize that lead pastors and pastoral staff should take a Sabbath rest—sabbatical-- to prevent burn-out and provide time for reflection, leadership renewal, and spiritual growth after five consecutive years of ministry.
 - a) The sabbatical should be a minimum of four to six weeks.
 - b) Timing of sabbatical should reflect the needs of the congregation.
 - c) Time allotted for continuing education or vacation should not be reduced.
 - d) Financial support of the pastor during the sabbatical period should include full benefits as well as a stipend to pursue the sabbatical.

VII. Benevolence

- If possible, give material assistance at Christmas to other pastors and their families who are in need.
- Honor retired pastors, evangelists, and missionaries (and their spouses) who are a part of their congregation by remembering them appropriately on special occasions.

VIII. Pulpit Supply

- Employ retired ministers for pulpit supply as frequently as possible and pay a minimum amount for pulpit supply of \$75.00- \$150 plus consideration of travel expenses.

Appendix E – Basic Local Church Financial Policies

The Manual of the Church of the Nazarene 2017-2021 provides financial direction for the local church and its subsidiaries.

129. Business. The business of the church board shall be:

129.21 To cause careful accounting to be kept of all money received and disbursed by the church, including any child-care/schools (birth through secondary) and Nazarene Missions International (NMI), Nazarene Youth International (NYI), Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI), and make report of the same at its regular monthly meetings and to the annual meeting of the church. (136.3–136.5)

129.22 To provide a committee, no fewer than two members of which shall count and account for all money received by the church.

129.23 To appoint an auditing committee or a committee of independent examiners, or such other qualified persons, that shall audit or examine, to at least the minimum standard required by national or state law if applicable, or other recognized professional standards, at least annually, the financial records of the treasurer of the church, the Nazarene Youth International (NYI), the Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) Board, Nazarene childcare/schools (birth through secondary), and any other financial records of the church. The pastor shall have access to all records of the local church.

136. Church Treasurer. The duties of the treasurer of the church board are:

136.1 To receive all moneys not otherwise provided for, and disburse the same only on order of the church board. (129.21)

136.2 To make monthly remittances of all district funds to the district treasurer, and of all general funds to the general treasurer through the appropriate office, except as otherwise provided. (516.9)

136.3 To keep a correct book record of all funds received and disbursed. (129.21)

136.4 To present a detailed monthly financial report for distribution to the church board. (129.21)

136.5 To present an annual financial report to the annual church meeting. (113.9, 129.21)

136.6 To deliver to the church board the complete treasurer's records at such time as the treasurer shall cease to hold the office.

518. The pastor and members of his or her immediate family are prohibited from creating financial obligations, spending funds, counting moneys, or having unrestricted access to financial accounts of the church. The church board or church meeting may, by majority vote, request an exception from the District Advisory Board and district superintendent. If the district

superintendent and a majority of the District Advisory Board approve the exception, the district superintendent will provide written approval of the request to the church board secretary, who will record the action in the church records. Immediate family shall include spouse, children, siblings, or parents. (129.1, 129.21–129.22)

In addition to the Manual requirements, the following provides additional information to guide the local church in wise stewardship of the church's resources.

1. **Offering.** When an offering is collected in a public service, it shall immediately be placed in a designated, locked place by a minimum of two persons.
2. **Counting.** Weekly tithes and offerings shall be counted within 48 hours of their reception by a minimum of two counters who are not related biologically or by marriage and who have been approved by the church board. Counting shall always occur on church property. All checks shall be stamped as "Deposit Only". Counters' reports (signed counters' sheet, list of checks, copy of deposit slip) shall be distributed to the pastor, church treasurer and church giving secretary.
3. **Deposits.** Weekly bank deposits shall occur within 2 business days. Deposits shall be made by someone approved by the church board. Weekly cash receipts shall be deposited in full with no provision at any time for a 'cash back' deposit.
4. **Online Giving.** The online giving vendor shall directly deposit all gifts into the church's checking account. At a minimum of once per month, the treasurer shall download the giving report from the online giving vendor, reconcile it with the bank statement, and enter the receipts into the treasurer's books. The giving secretary shall also download the vendor's report monthly and enter the gifts in the record. The vendor's merchant fees shall be paid from a dedicated budget line item and not be deducted from the donations.
5. **Bank.** The selection of the bank and the type of account(s) shall be the decision of the church board. The opening and closing of bank accounts shall also be within the purview of the church board. All accounts opened by the church shall have a minimum of two authorized signers.
6. **Bank Statements.** It shall be the responsibility of the church treasurer to reconcile bank statements on a monthly basis.
7. **Online Financial Accounts.** Only those persons approved by the church board shall be given access to online accounts (bank, vendors, etc.) and their passwords. A minimum of two persons shall be given access to each online account.

8. **Check Generation.** Checks shall be generated by a person(s) designated by the church board.
9. **Check Signatures.** Persons authorized to sign church checks shall be the decision of the church board.
10. **Disbursements.** The church treasurer is authorized to make routine, repetitive disbursements (salaries, utilities, debt service payments, etc.) within budgetary limits. Upon receiving a requisition from the appropriate staff member, department head or committee chair, the treasurer is also authorized to make other disbursements within budgetary limits. All other disbursements or disbursements above \$XXX.XX must be authorized by action of the church board
11. **Credit Cards.** Corporate credit cards shall be issued to staff members or volunteers in the church's name when appropriate. Staff members or volunteers are expected to restrict the usage of these cards to church related expenditures. Each card should have a credit limit that is the maximum necessary for the person to function in their area of ministry as determined by the church board/finance committee. The church treasurer shall pay the total balance of each card by the due date. In order to facilitate timely payment and avoid finance charges, each staff member or volunteer responsible for such credit card should identify charges as to ministry area, attach supporting documents, and forward the monthly statement and receipts to the church treasurer as soon as possible after receiving such. The church board/Finance Committee shall maintain a list of approved Credit Cards and the responsible/authorized users of such card.
12. **Petty Cash.** Petty cash shall be in the amount of \$XXX.XX and shall be kept securely locked in the church office at all times. Monthly the treasurer shall reconcile receipts (all of which shall have appropriate account numbers noted on them) and current cash. After this reconciliation, cash shall be brought back to \$XXX.XX.
13. **Check Requests.** All check requests must be signed by the person requesting the check and by a pastor or the Finance Committee chair. For appropriate reimbursements, all pastors shall submit a check request form which shall be signed by the Finance Committee chair.
14. **Cash Advances.** Any checks payable to 'cash' (for example as an advance on legitimate church-related expenses) must be documented with a signed receipt from the person receiving the cash, notating the purpose for the advance. This shall be followed with applicable receipts and reimbursement request documentation once the cash is spent for its appropriate purpose.
15. **Payroll.** All pastoral and support staff members shall be issued payroll checks every Friday. Provision should be made for alternative payment schedules...i.e. bi-weekly or monthly, etc.

16. **Retirement Account Contributions.** Retirement payments made to Fidelity on behalf of pastors or pastoral staff shall be paid by the 15th of each month.
17. **Denominational Allocations.** All denominational allocations (WEF, District) shall be paid monthly.
18. **Taxes.** It shall be the responsibility of the church treasurer to submit quarterly payroll tax reports to the IRS (941) and state taxation authority. It shall also be the duty of the treasurer to remit local property taxes in a timely manner where appropriate.
19. **Treasurer's Report (Church Financial Statements).** The church treasurer shall distribute to the pastor and all church board members a current report of all receipts, disbursements and balances at or before the monthly church board meeting. This report shall reflect the annual budget per line item vs. the actual receipts/disbursements per line item. This report may be distributed electronically, in print or both.
20. **Giving Records.** Accurate giving records shall be maintained by the church giving secretary in a timely fashion. This person shall be appointed by the church board.
21. **Annual Giving Statements.** The church giving secretary shall prepare and distribute the annual giving statements by January 31. Per IRS publication 1771, the annual giving statement must include a statement that "no goods or services were provided by the church in return for the contribution". The pastor may review these statements at his/her discretion. (*Manual* 129.23).
22. **Designated Giving.** All monies given by a donor for a specific cause or purpose shall be carefully reserved for that cause or purpose and not used for any other cause or purpose without the consent of the donor. Detail of designated funds should be reflected on the Balance Sheet and carefully reserved for that purpose. Detail of designated funds should be reflected on the Balance Sheet and carefully reserved for that purpose.
23. **Gifts of Stocks/Mutual Funds.** Gifts of stocks/mutual funds shall be converted into cash immediately through the church's designated financial services company. The donor shall be given a receipt which specifies the following: date of gift, name of company/fund, total number of shares. No monetary value shall be placed on the receipt.
24. **Non-cash Gifts.** The acceptance of all non-cash gifts shall be at the discretion of the church board. The donor shall be given a receipt which specifies the following: date of gift, description of the gift, condition of the gift. No monetary value shall be placed on the receipt.

25. **Annual Review of Church Financial Statements.** The church board shall make provision for the church financial statements (treasurer's books) to be audited/reviewed/examined by an external accountant or firm or by an internal committee appointed by the church board. Special attention shall be given to *Manual* 129.23.
26. **Record Retention.** All church financial records (church financial statements, invoices, requisitions, annual review reports, etc.) shall be kept in a designated place within the church building for ten years or per government regulatory requirements, whichever is greater.
27. **Deposit Check Retention.** The church shall be in compliance with their local bank policies/procedures.
28. **Insurance Review.** The church board shall make provision for the church property and liability insurance policy(s) to reviewed annually. Diligent consideration shall always be given to full replacement costs for structures, contents, and any changes required in rebuilding due to federal, state, and local building code updates.
29. **Renting/Leasing of Church Facilities.** The church should adopt a Facility Use policy approved by the church board. Approval of the renting/leasing of the church facilities shall be within the authority of the church board. All renting/leasing organizations shall submit proof of appropriate liability insurance.
30. **Budget.** A comprehensive, balanced church budget shall be prepared annually by the church board or by a committee appointed by the church board. The church board shall approve the final budget.

El pastor tendrá acceso a todos los registros de la iglesia local.

136. Tesorero de la Iglesia. Los deberes del tesorero de la junta de la iglesia son:

136.3 Mantener un registro contable correcto de todos los fondos recibidos y desembolsados. (129.21)

136.4 Presentar un informe financiero mensual detallado para distribuirlo a la junta de la iglesia. (129.21)

136.5 Presentar un informe financiero anual a la reunión anual de la iglesia. (113.9, 129.21)

136.6 Para entregar a la junta de la iglesia los registros completos del tesorero en el momento en que el tesorero deje de ocupar el cargo.

518. El pastor y los miembros de su familia inmediata tienen prohibido crear obligaciones financieras, gastar fondos, contar dinero o tener acceso sin restricciones a las cuentas financieras de la iglesia. La junta de la iglesia o la reunión de la iglesia pueden, por mayoría de votos, solicitar una excepción a la Junta Asesora del Distrito y al superintendente del distrito. Si el

Appendix E – Basic Local Church Financial Policies

The Manual of the Church of the Nazarene 2017-2021 provides financial direction for the local church.

129. Business. The business of the church board shall be:

129.21 To cause careful accounting to be kept of all money received and disbursed by the church, including any child-care/schools (birth through secondary) and Nazarene Missions International (NMI), Nazarene Youth International (NYI), Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI), and make report of the same at its regular monthly meetings and to the annual meeting of the church. (136.3–136.5)

129.22 To provide a committee, no fewer than two members of which shall count and account for all money received by the church.

129.23 To appoint an auditing committee or a committee of independent examiners, or such other qualified persons, that shall audit or examine, to at least the minimum standard required by national or state law if applicable, or other recognized professional standards, at least annually, the financial records of the treasurer of the church, the Nazarene Youth International (NYI), the Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) Board, Nazarene childcare/schools (birth through secondary), and any other financial records of the church. The pastor shall have access to all records of the local church.

136. Church Treasurer. The duties of the treasurer of the church board are:

136.1 To receive all moneys not otherwise provided for, and disburse the same only on order of the church board. (129.21)

136.2 To make monthly remittances of all district funds to the district treasurer, and of all general funds to the general treasurer through the appropriate office, except as otherwise provided. (516.9)

136.3 To keep a correct book record of all funds received and disbursed. (129.21)

136.4 To present a detailed monthly financial report for distribution to the church board. (129.21)

136.5 To present an annual financial report to the annual church meeting. (113.9, 129.21)

136.6 To deliver to the church board the complete treasurer's records at such time as the treasurer shall cease to hold the office.

518. The pastor and members of his or her immediate family are prohibited from creating financial obligations, spending funds, counting moneys, or having unrestricted access to financial accounts of the church. The church board or church meeting may, by majority vote, request an exception from the District Advisory Board and district superintendent. If the district superintendent and a majority of the District Advisory Board approve the exception, the district superintendent will provide written approval of the request to the church board secretary, who will record the action in the church records. Immediate family shall include spouse, children, siblings, or parents. (129.1, 129.21–129.22)

13. **Check Requests.** All check requests must be signed by the person requesting the check and by a pastor or the Finance Committee chair. For appropriate reimbursements, all pastors shall submit a check request form which shall be signed by the Finance Committee chair.
14. **Cash Advances.** Any checks payable to 'cash' (for example as an advance on legitimate church-related expenses) must be documented with a signed receipt from the person receiving the cash, notating the purpose for the advance. This shall be followed with applicable receipts and reimbursement request documentation once the cash is spent for its appropriate purpose.

15. **Payroll.** All pastoral and support staff members shall be issued payroll checks every Friday. Provision should be made for alternative payment schedules...i.e. bi-weekly or monthly, etc.
16. **Retirement Account Contributions.** Retirement payments made to Fidelity on behalf of pastors or pastoral staff shall be paid by the 15th of each month.
17. **Denominational Allocations.** All denominational allocations (WEF, District) shall be paid monthly.
18. **Taxes.** It shall be the responsibility of the church treasurer to submit quarterly payroll tax reports to the IRS (941) and state taxation authority. It shall also be the duty of the treasurer to remit local property taxes in a timely manner where appropriate.
19. **Treasurer's Report (Church Financial Statements).** The church treasurer shall distribute to the pastor and all church board members a current report of all receipts, disbursements and balances at or before the monthly church board meeting. This report shall reflect the annual budget per line item vs. the actual receipts/disbursements per line item. This report may be distributed electronically, in print or both.
20. **Giving Records.** Accurate giving records shall be maintained by the church giving secretary in a timely fashion. This person shall be appointed by the church board.
21. **Annual Giving Statements.** The church giving secretary shall prepare and distribute the annual giving statements by January 31. Per IRS publication 1771, the annual giving statement must include a statement that "no goods or services were provided by the church in return for the contribution". The pastor may review these statements at his/her discretion. (*Manual* 129.23).
22. **Designated Giving.** All monies given by a donor for a specific cause or purpose shall be carefully reserved for that cause or purpose and not used for any other cause or purpose without the consent of the donor. Detail of designated funds should be reflected on the Balance Sheet and carefully reserved for that purpose. Detail of designated funds should be reflected on the Balance Sheet and carefully reserved for that purpose.
23. **Gifts of Stocks/Mutual Funds.** Gifts of stocks/mutual funds shall be converted into cash immediately through the church's designated financial services company. The donor shall be given a receipt which specifies the following: date of gift, name of company/fund, total number of shares. No monetary value shall be placed on the receipt.
24. **Non-cash Gifts.** The acceptance of all non-cash gifts shall be at the discretion of the church board. The donor shall be given a receipt which specifies the following: date of gift, description of the gift, condition of the gift. No monetary value shall be placed on the receipt.

25. **Annual Review of Church Financial Statements.** The church board shall make provision for the church financial statements (treasurer's books) to be audited/reviewed/examined by an external accountant or firm or by an internal committee appointed by the church board. Special attention shall be given to *Manual* 129.23.
26. **Record Retention.** All church financial records (church financial statements, invoices, requisitions, annual review reports, etc.) shall be kept in a designated place within the church building for ten years or per government regulatory requirements, whichever is greater.
27. **Deposit Check Retention.** The church shall be in compliance with their local bank policies/procedures.
28. **Insurance Review.** The church board shall make provision for the church property and liability insurance policy(s) to reviewed annually. Diligent consideration shall always be given to full replacement costs for structures, contents, and any changes required in rebuilding due to federal, state, and local building code updates.
29. **Renting/Leasing of Church Facilities.** The church should adopt a Facility Use policy approved by the church board. Approval of the renting/leasing of the church facilities shall be within the authority of the church board. All renting/leasing organizations shall submit proof of appropriate liability insurance.
30. **Budget.** A comprehensive, balanced church budget shall be prepared annually by the church board or by a committee appointed by the church board. The church board shall approve the final budget.

Appendix E- Les reglements de base financiere pour l'église locale

Le manuel de l'église du Nazareen pouvoir une direction financiere pour l'église locale

129. Travaux. Les travaux du conseil de l'église seront:

129.21. Assurer une gestion comptable, soignée et conservée un registre de toutes les sommes reçues et dépensées par l'église, y compris toutes les garderies et écoles (jusqu'au secondaire) et la MNI, la JNI et les MEDFDI et d'en faire un rapport au cours de ses réunions mensuelles régulières ainsi qu'à la réunion annuelle de l'église. (136.3-136.5)

129.22. Instituer un comité dont au moins deux membres compteront et rendront compte de toutes les sommes reçues par l'église locale.

129.23. Nommer un comité de vérification des comptes, ou un comité de reviseurs indépendants, ou toutes autres personnes qualifiées, qui vérifieront ou examineront, au moins selon le minimum requis par la loi nationale ou régionale si applicable, ou d'autres normes professionnelles reconnues, au moins une fois par an, les comptes financiers du trésorier de l'église locale, de la JNI, des MEDFDI, des garderies et écoles (jusqu'au secondaire) et de tous les autres livres de comptes de l'église. Le pasteur aura accès à tous les registres de l'église locale.

136. Le trésorier de l'église. Les devoirs du trésorier du conseil de l'église sont:

136.1. Recevoir toutes les sommes non prévues ailleurs et de ne les verser qu'à la demande du conseil de l'église. (129.21)

136.2. Remettre mensuellement tous les fonds du district au trésorier de district et tous les fonds généraux au Trésorier général par l'intermédiaire approprié, sauf sur stipulation contraire. (516.9)

136.3. Garder à jour un livre de compte de tous les fonds reçus et versés. (129.21)

136.4. Présenter chaque mois un rapport financier détaillé pour être distribué aux membres du conseil de l'église. (129.21)

136.5. Présenter un rapport financier annuel à la réunion annuelle de l'église. (113.9, 129.21)

136.6. Présenter au conseil de l'église tous les registres du trésorier, lorsque le trésorier cessera d'être en fonction.

518. Le pasteur et les membres de sa famille immédiate sont interdits de créer des obligations financières, de dépenser des fonds, de compter l'argent ou d'avoir un accès illimité aux comptes financiers de l'église. Le conseil de l'église ou une réunion de l'église peut, par vote majoritaire, demander une exception auprès du conseil consultatif de district et du surintendant de district. Si le surintendant de district et une majorité du conseil consultatif de district approuvent

l'exception, le surintendant de district fournira une approbation écrite suite à la demande du secrétaire du conseil de l'église qui enregistrera l'action dans les registres de l'église. La famille immédiate inclura l'épouse/époux, les enfants, frères et sœurs ou parents. (129.1, 129.21-129.22)

Outre les exigences du manuel, vous trouverez ci-après des informations supplémentaires pour guider l'église locale dans la gestion judicieuse de ses ressources.

1. **Offrande.** Lorsqu'une offrande est collectée dans un service public, elle doit être immédiatement placée dans un endroit désigné et verrouillé par au moins deux personnes.
2. **Compter.** Les dîmes et les offrandes hebdomadaires doivent être comptées dans les 48 heures suivant leur réception par au moins deux comptables qui ne sont pas liés biologiquement ou par un mariage et qui ont été approuvés par le conseil de l'église. Le décompte doit toujours se faire sur la propriété de l'église. Tous les chèques doivent porter la mention «Dépôt seulement». Les rapports des compteurs (feuille de compteurs signée, liste des chèques, copie du bordereau de dépôt) seront distribués au pasteur, au trésorier de l'église et au secrétaire des églises.
3. **Dépôts.** Les dépôts bancaires hebdomadaires doivent être effectués dans un délai de deux jours ouvrables. Les dépôts doivent être effectués par une personne approuvée par le conseil de l'église. Les encaissements hebdomadaires doivent être déposés en totalité, sans aucune provision à tout moment pour un dépôt de type "cash back".
4. **Dons en ligne.** Le fournisseur de dons en ligne déposera directement tous les cadeaux dans le compte courant de l'église. Au moins une fois par mois, le trésorier télécharge le rapport de don du fournisseur et de dons en ligne, le rapproche du relevé bancaire et enregistre les recettes dans les livres du trésorier. Le secrétaire donateur télécharge également le rapport du fournisseur tous les mois et inscrit les cadeaux dans le dossier. Les honoraires du fournisseur sont payés à partir d'un poste budgétaire spécifique et ne sont pas déduits des dons.
5. **Banque.** Le choix de la banque et du type de compte (s) sera décidé par le conseil de l'église. L'ouverture et la fermeture des comptes bancaires sont également du ressort du conseil de l'église. Tous les comptes ouverts par l'église doivent comporter au moins deux signatures autorisées.
6. **Relevés bancaires.** Il incombe au trésorier de l'église de reconciler les relevés bancaires tous les mois.
7. **Comptes financiers en ligne.** Seules les personnes approuvées par le conseil de l'église auront accès aux comptes en ligne (banque, fournisseurs, etc.) et à leurs mots de passe. Un minimum de deux personnes doivent avoir accès à chaque compte en ligne.
8. **Vérifier la génération.** Les chèques doivent être générés par une personne désignée par le conseil de l'église.
9. **Vérifiez les signatures.** Les personnes autorisées à signer les chèques paroissiaux sont la décision du conseil de l'église.

10. Décaissements. Le trésorier de l'église est autorisé à effectuer des décaissements réguliers et répétitifs (salaires, services publics, paiements du service de la dette, etc.) dans les limites budgétaires. Sur réception d'une demande émanant du membre du personnel concerné, du chef de département ou du président de comité, le trésorier est également autorisé à effectuer d'autres décaissements dans les limites du budget. Tous les autres débits ou décaissements supérieurs à XXX.XX \$ doivent être autorisés par une action du conseil de l'église.

11. Cartes de crédit. Les cartes de crédit professionnelles doivent être émises aux membres du personnel ou aux bénévoles au nom de l'église, le cas échéant. Les membres du personnel ou les bénévoles sont censés limiter l'utilisation de ces cartes aux dépenses liées à l'église. Chaque carte devrait avoir une limite de crédit qui est le maximum nécessaire pour que la personne puisse exercer ses activités dans son ministère, comme déterminé par le conseil d'administration / comité des finances de l'église. Le trésorier de l'église doit payer la balance totale de chaque carte à la date d'échéance. Afin de faciliter le paiement dans les délais et d'éviter les frais financiers, chaque membre du personnel ou volontaire responsable d'une telle carte de crédit doit identifier les frais correspondant à la zone du ministère, joindre les pièces justificatives et transmettre le relevé mensuel et les reçus au trésorier de l'église dès que possible après avoir reçu tel. Le conseil de l'église / le comité des finances doit tenir une liste des cartes de crédit approuvées et des utilisateurs responsables / autorisés de cette carte.

12. Petite caisse. La petite caisse doit représenter un montant de XXX.XX \$ et doit être gardée en toute sécurité dans le bureau de l'église en tout temps. Tous les mois, le trésorier doit rapprocher les recettes (qui doivent toutes porter les numéros de compte appropriés) et de la trésorerie courante. Après ce rapprochement, les espèces doivent être ramenées à XXX, XX \$.

13. Vérifier les demandes. Toutes les demandes de chèques doivent être signées par la personne qui les demande et par un pasteur ou le président du comité des finances. Pour les remboursements appropriés, tous les pasteurs doivent soumettre un formulaire de demande de chèque, qui doit être signé par le président du Comité des finances.

14. Avances de fonds. Tous les chèques libellés à l'argent comptant (par exemple à titre d'avance sur des dépenses légitimes liées à une église) doivent être accompagnés d'un reçu signé de la personne qui reçoit l'argent, en indiquant le but de l'avance. Ceci doit être suivi avec les reçus et la documentation de demande de remboursement applicables une fois que l'argent a été dépensé à ses fins.

15. Paiement. Tous les membres du personnel de pastorale et de soutien recevront un chèque de paiement chaque vendredi. Des dispositions devraient être prises pour des calendriers de paiement alternatifs... à savoir. toutes les deux semaines ou tous les mois, etc.

16. Contributions au compte de retraite. Les paiements de retraite versés à Fidelity pour le compte de pasteurs ou d'équipes pastorales sont versés au plus tard le 15 de chaque mois.

17. Allocations denominationnelles. Toutes les attributions denominationnelles (WEF, District) seront payées mensuellement.

18. Taxes. Il incombe au trésorier de l'église de soumettre des rapports trimestriels sur les impôts sur les salaires à l'IRS (941) et aux autorités fiscales de l'État. Il incombe également au trésorier de verser les taxes foncières locales en temps utile, le cas échéant.

19. Rapport du trésorier (états financiers de l'Église). Le trésorier de l'église distribue au pasteur et à tous les membres du conseil de l'église un rapport à jour sur tous les reçus, déboursés et balances au plus tard à la réunion mensuelle du conseil de l'église. Ce rapport doit refléter le budget annuel par article par rapport aux recettes / décaissements réels par article. Ce rapport peut être distribué par voie électronique, sur papier ou les deux.

20. Registre des Dons. Des registres de dons précis doivent être tenus par l'église qui donne de secrétaire en temps opportun. Cette personne sera nommée par le conseil de l'église.

21. Déclarations de dons annuels. Le secrétaire de l'église préparera et distribuera les déclarations de dons annuel avant le 31 janvier. Selon la publication IRS 1771, la déclaration de dons annuel doit inclure une déclaration selon laquelle «aucun bien ni service n'a été fourni par l'église en échange de la contribution». Le pasteur peut examiner ces déclarations à sa discrétion. (Manuel 129.23).

22. Dons désignés. Tous les fonds donnés par un donneur pour une cause ou un but spécifique doivent être soigneusement réservés pour cette cause ou ce but et ne doivent pas être utilisés pour une autre cause ou but sans le consentement du donateur. Le détail des fonds désignés doit figurer sur le bilan et être soigneusement réservé à cet effet. Le détail des fonds désignés doit figurer sur le bilan et être soigneusement réservé à cet effet.

23. Dons d'actions / fonds communs de placement. Les dons d'actions ou de fonds communs de placement doivent être immédiatement convertis en espèces par l'intermédiaire de la société de services financiers désignée par l'église. Le donateur recevra un reçu spécifiant les éléments suivants: date du don, nom de la société / du fonds, nombre total d'actions. Aucune valeur monétaire ne doit être placée sur le reçu.

24. Dons non monétaires. L'acceptation de tous les cadeaux non monétaires sera à la discrétion du conseil de l'église. Le donateur recevra un reçu spécifiant les éléments suivants: date du cadeau, description du cadeau, état du cadeau. Aucune valeur monétaire ne doit être placée sur le reçu.

25. Revue annuel des états financiers de l'Église. Le conseil de l'église doit prévoir que les états financiers de l'église (livres du trésorier) soient vérifiés / examinés / examinés par un comptable externe ou un cabinet, ou par un comité interne nommé par le conseil de l'église. Une attention particulière doit être accordée au Manuel 129.23.

26. Conservation des enregistrements. Tous les registres financiers de l'église (états financiers de l'église, factures, réquisitions, rapports de révision annuelle, etc.) doivent être conservés dans un endroit désigné à l'intérieur de l'église pendant dix ans ou selon les exigences réglementaires gouvernementales, si ce délai est supérieur.

27. Conservation du chèque de dépôt. L'église doit être en conformité avec les règlements / procédures de sa banque locale.

28. Révision de l'assurance. Le conseil de l'église doit prévoir une révision annuelle des polices d'assurance de biens et de responsabilité civile de l'église. Les coûts de remplacement intégral des structures et du contenu, ainsi que tout changement nécessaire à la reconstruction suite aux mises à jour du code du bâtiment aux niveaux fédéral, régional et local, doivent toujours faire l'objet d'une attention particulière.

29. Location/utilisation de l'église. L'église devrait adopter un règlement d'utilisation des installations approuvé par le conseil de l'église. L'approbation de la location ou de l'utilisation de l'église sera à l'autorisation du conseil de l'église. Tous les organismes de location doivent présenter une preuve de leur assurance responsabilité appropriée.

30. Budget. Un budget complet et équilibré de l'église doit être préparé chaque année par le conseil de l'église ou par un comité nommé par le conseil de l'église. Le conseil de l'église doit approuver le budget final.

Step by Step Preparation for Ministry Procedures

Mid-Atlantic District Church of the Nazarene

Step One: **Clarification of the call**

- ⇒ Talking and praying with spiritual mentors
- ⇒ Talking and praying with local church pastor
- ⇒ Is the call to ministry or vocation?
- ⇒ Is the call to Elder (preaching) or Deacon track?

Step Two: **Request for Local Minister' s License**

(Information for Local Minister's License may be found at <https://www.usacanadaregion.org/ministry/clergy-development/call-ministry/tools-for-the-local-church>.)

- ⇒ Interview with the local church board
 - * Spiritual experience (salvation, entire sanctification)
 - * Doctrinal understandings (Articles of Faith)
 - * Spiritual formation and disciplines (prayer, Bible reading, etc)
 - * Ministry experience (teaching, leadership, witnessing, etc.)
 - * Gifts and graces for ministry as well as your spiritual gifts
- ⇒ Establish prayer partners
- ⇒ Be involved in an assignment for ministry in the church – See local pastor
- ⇒ **Request a Ministry Log from Norman Huffman and begin to log your ministry experience**
- ⇒ **If not already enrolled with Williamson Bible Institute (WBI) do so immediately. This is the District Ministerial Studies Board. Even if enrolled in an educational institution please contact Norman Huffman**
- ⇒ ***Must have a Local Minister' s License for at least one year and completed at least six courses (must include "History & Polity of the Church of the Nazarene" & "Exploring Christian Holiness") in the Course of Study for Ministers.***
- ⇒ ***If candidate or spouse is divorced please contact Norman Huffman. The divorce must be "removed as a barrier to ordination" by the Board of General Superintendent before receiving your first district license.***

Step Three: **Request for District Minister' s License**

- ⇒ Full and unreserved recommendation from the local church pastor
- ⇒ Have completed the required studies (6 courses; one of which must include "History & Polity of the Church of the Nazarene)) and reported to WBI
- ⇒ Interview with the local church board
 - * Review the list above
 - * Full and unreserved recommendation from the church board
 - * Recommendation submitted to the District Secretary, Norman

Huffman

- * Church board should consider providing financial assistance to attend the Ministry Assessment Center (MAC)
- ⇒ Complete the application for District Minister' s License by September 1st
- ⇒ Attend **TEAM Day** (first Saturday of November) to complete the assessment testing for **Ministry Assessment Center**
- ⇒ Attend the **Ministry Assessment Center** (MAC) in early January
 - * Complete MAC forms and submit by October 31st. Forms may be secured from Norman Huffman in early September
- ⇒ Request an appointment for interview with the Board of Ministry for the annual meeting (usually the first full week of February). Your spouse (if applicable) and pastor/mentor should attend with you.
- ⇒ Recommendation to the District Assembly comes from the Board of Ministry

Step Four: **Annual Renewal of District Minister' s License**

- ⇒ Completion of required studies (at least 2 classes per year) and reported to WBI (Norman Huffman)
- ⇒ Full and unreserved recommendation from the pastor and local church board
- ⇒ Annual renewal meeting with one of the Board of Ministry Sub-Committees
- ⇒ Recommendation for renewal of district minister's license to the District Assembly comes from the Board of Ministry

Step Five: **Request for Consideration for Ordination**

- ⇒ Graduated from the *Manual* Course of Study for Ministers (This **may** be different from graduation from one of our schools or colleges)
- ⇒ Completed the required Practice of Ministry Competencies
- ⇒ Completed the required years of experience in consecutive years of ministry
- ⇒ Attend the required **Ordination Seminar** with District Superintendent David Bowser, beginning in the Fall of each year prior to meeting with the full Board of Ministry.
- ⇒ Request an appointment with the Board of Ministry for February meeting

Step Six: **Ordination**

- ⇒ Conditioned upon recommendation from the Board of Ministry, affirmative vote of the District Assembly and the approval of the General Superintendent in jurisdiction
- ⇒ Ordination Service will be held at the annual District Assembly in April

CRITERIA FOR ORDINATION

After a candidate has met the minimal service and educational pre-requisites, the Board of Ministry will evaluate the following areas:

1. Evidence of spiritual maturity and growth, which is evidenced by high moral ethical behavior.
2. Evidence of doctrinal and biblical integrity, comprehension, and articulation.
3. Evidence of churchmanship, knowledge of church history and polity.
4. Evidence of the gifts and graces necessary for ministry, as seen in his or her ministry assignment(s).
5. Evidence of personal maturity (and common sense) befitting an ordained minister in the Church of the Nazarene.
6. Evidence of a life-style that prioritizes family relationships and in cases of unhealthy relationships peruses reconciliation.

Experience Requirement for Ordination

2017-2021 *Manual*, ¶ 533 – The Deacon; ¶ 534 – The Elder

A deacon / elder candidate professes a call of God to this ministry. The candidate currently holds a district license, and has at one time held a license for not fewer than three consecutive years. In addition, the candidate has been recommended for renewal of district license by the church board of the local church in which he or she holds membership or by the District Advisory Board. Further the candidate:

1. has fulfilled all the requirements of the church for the same,
2. has successfully completed a validated course of study prescribed for licensed ministers and candidates for ordination as deacon, and
3. has been carefully considered and favorably reported by the District Ministerial Credentials Board or District Board of Ministry to the district assembly.

The candidate may be elected to the order of deacon / elder by two-thirds vote of the district assembly; provided he or she has been an assigned minister not fewer than three consecutive years; and provided further that the candidate must currently be serving in an assigned ministry. In the case of part-time assignment, it should be understood that there should be an extension of the consecutive years of in-service time, depending on their level of involvement in local church ministry, and that their testimony and service demonstrate that their call to ministry is primary to all other pursuits. Further, any disqualification that may have been imposed by a district assembly has been removed in writing by the district superintendent and District Advisory Board of said district; and provided further that his or her marriage relationship does not render him or her ineligible for ordination. (205.6, 320, 529)

Recommendation for Application to the Board of Ministry

We recommend that the Mid-Atlantic District encourage all candidates seeking ordination pursue Elders orders. We believe that all ordained ministers are carrying out the task of pastoral leadership of the Church. We further recommend that candidates testifying to call to the supportive ministry as an associate or assistant minister pursue specialties in the area of their call. Williamson Bible Institute, serving as the Board of Ministerial Studies, will work with the candidate in electives that support that calling.

All candidates must have a current District Minister's License which has been held for at least three consecutive years prior to ordination, complete the required course of studies for ministry and fulfill the required time of service within the Church of the Nazarene that provides important experience and reflects gifts and graces necessary as an ordained minister of the gospel. At the

time of ordination the candidate must be serving in an assigned ministry position in the Church of the Nazarene.

We recommend the following requirements for time of service for ordination in the Church of the Nazarene on the Mid-Atlantic District.

1. Three consecutive years as a lead or senior pastor.
2. Three consecutive years of service as a full time associate or assistant pastor. Full time shall be identified as 30 *plus* hours per week.
3. One year as a Lead or Senior Pastor and two consecutive years as an assigned associate or assistant pastor.

In keeping with the requirement that there should be an extension of the consecutive years of in-service time for those serving in associate roles who are not full time, the policy of the Mid-Atlantic Board of Ministry as required by the Board of General Superintendents is as follows:

Two years of part-time (2 – 29 hours per week) = 1 year of service

This service requirement will begin with the first district license in a specific ministry assignment within a local church. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to provide a detailed listing of their ministry assignments, including position, basic responsibilities and hours per week. This form must be signed off by the Lead Pastor or supervisor for that assignment.

Accountability of service shall be provided by a log of ministry maintained by the candidate, signed by the pastor and sent annually to the district secretary with the annual applications for district minister's license or ordination. This log will be provided by the Board of Ministry.

Approved Delivery Systems

There are a number of ways that individuals may fulfill the required coursework for the Course of Study for Ministry in the Church of the Nazarene through Williamson Bible Institute. The following list covers these various approved delivery systems through which the required course work can be completed.

Transfer of Courses

If students have taken courses through another one of our Nazarene educational institutions (i.e. Eastern Nazarene College, Nazarene Theological Seminary, Nazarene Bible College, including NBC's Online Program), that course work may be submitted for credit providing the student arranges to have their transcript(s) sent to the WBI Director at the Mid-Atlantic District Ministry Resource Center. This course work will be evaluated by the WBI Director with assistance from the Academic Dean to determine which courses would be eligible to transfer into the WBI Course of Study.

Course work from other accredited educational institutions may also be submitted for this same evaluation process; however there will be certain courses, especially in the area of theology that may not be transferable.

WBI Classes

The primary means through which course may be taken is through the regular schedule of classes offered by Williamson Bible Institute. These classes are offered at various sites via Zoom and in person that meet one day a week to a series of Saturday intensive classes. Other intensive classes are offered from time to time such as a class at District Family Camp. These classes are taught by qualified instructors, with a minimum of a Masters Degree in Religion or other appropriate field.

WBI has also begun to offer some of their classes in an online format. This format is sometimes combined with one or two sessions "on the ground."

NBC Ministry Preparation Program (On-Line)

Students are permitted to take coursework through Nazarene Bible College's Ministry Preparation Program (MPP). There are two options available. 1) Full credit and undergraduate degree program and 2) Ordination credit of one credit per course (which may be applied for a future degree).

Directed Study

Students are allowed to take some of their coursework in a directed study format. A Directed Study **MUST** be done with the approval of the WBI Director and with an approved WBI Instructor. The student should expect to meet with the instructor 3-4 times in addition to the reading and other assignments that the instructor will require.

Students may not take more than seven courses (out of 24) via a Directed Study. It is recommended that students reserve this option for the end of their course work when they may need a specific class that is not being offered at the time.

Modular Course of Study

While some districts allow students to take the Course of Study Modules (which replaced the Home Course of Study) to meet the requirements for ordination, it is the policy of WBI and the Mid-Atlantic District that because the expectations of Williamson Bible Institute and the Mid-Atlantic District are higher than the basic requirements of the Modular Course of Study, it is our policy not to accept work done through the Modules while residing on the Mid-Atlantic District.

If a ministerial student transfers to the Mid-Atlantic District having completed Modules while on another district we will grant credit for the work completed.
